Flagstaff Festival of the Sciences Hike to Laws Spring

Join Kaibab National Forest Heritage and Tribal Program Manager Margaret Hangan and Williams/Tusayan District Archaeologist Neil Weintraub for an interpretive hike to Laws Spring. We'll explore the area's petroglyphs and rich history while looking at historic photographs that document the changing landscape.

Meet at the Route 66 Interpretive Pullout north of the Pitman Valley exit off I-40 (Exit 171) at 9 AM sharp. From there it is about a 12 mile (35 minute) drive north to the site on well grade Forest Service dirt roads. Bring water, camera, snacks and rain gear. It is a short ¼ mile hike, but somewhat rocky.
