



## Blue Fly Proctor Trail, NO. 33054

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District

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**General Description:** The highlights of this trail are hiking through pink ledges. This trail is a connector from Proctor Canyon to Blue Fly Road.

**Trail Use:** Foot, horse, and bicycle

**Length:** 0.8 miles one way

**Trailhead Information:** Accessed by a dirt road, no restroom available at the trailhead

**Elevation in Feet:** Min: 8,060                      Max: 8,585                      Change: 525



**Water Availability:** No water available at the trailhead or along the trail

**Hazards /Obstacles:** Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year-round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms.

**Topographic Maps:** USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle(s): Tropic Reservoir

**The Trailhead:** From the junction of US Highway 89, and Proctor Canyon Road, No. 109, out of Hatch, approximately 6 miles to the trailhead. The trailhead is on the northeast side of the road.

**The Trail:** The bottom section of trail follows an old road approximately 0.5 miles, it then begins climbing up and through the pink ledges and ends at the Blue Fly Road, No. 110.
