



## Sheep Creek Trail, No. 33049

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District

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**General Description:** This is a short trail that takes you up to the Bryce Canyon National Park boundary offering a sneak peak of the claron formation.

**Trail Use:** Foot, horse, and bicycle

**Length:** 1.4 miles one way

**Trailhead Information:** Accessed by a dirt road that is in bad repair, vault restroom available at the trailhead

**Elevation in Feet:** Min: 6,780                      Max: 8,040                      Change: 1,260



**Water Availability:** Water is available during spring runoff, but must be treated or filtered. It is located in drainage at the trailhead.

**Hazards /Obstacles:** Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year-round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms. Road is impassable when wet.

**Topographic Maps:** USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle(s): Bryce Point

**The Trailhead:** From Utah Highway 12 travel south out of Cannonville on Cottonwood Canyon Road approximately 2 miles and turn east on Sheep Creek Road travel for about 7 miles where you will reach the Sheep Creek Trailhead.

**The Trail:** This trail is a scenic spur off of the Grandview Trail that provides good views from the canyon floor of Bryce Canyon National Park.
