



Pole Canyon Trail, No. 33007

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District

General Description: This trail has a continuous slope and travels through a heavily wooded area. This trail offers spectacular views of the Sunset Cliffs.

Trail Use: Foot, horse, and bicycle

Length: 1.5 miles one way

Trailhead Information: Accessed by a graded gravel road, no restroom available at the trailhead

Elevation in Feet: Min: 8,200 Max: 9,000 Change: 800



Water Availability: Water is available in the spring, but must be treated or filtered. It is located at the bottom of the trail near the forest boundary.

Hazards /Obstacles: Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year-round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms.

Topographic Maps: USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle(s): George Mountain

The Trailhead: From the junction of US Highway 89 and Bryce Woodlands Road (6.5 miles south of Hatch), turn left and go east following the Bryce Woodlands Road for approximately 7 miles to the trailhead, which is the end of road.

The Trail: This trail travels through a mixed conifer forest and is heavily wooded. This route is a continuous slope and connects to the Right Fork of Kanab Creek and Bryce Woodlands subdivision. This trail can be used to for access to the Grand view Trail.
