
Welcome to your National Forest!

Tools and Tips

Before you embark on these trails please keep the following in mind.

- Be prepared for all weather conditions you may encounter
- Let someone know where you will be and an estimated time of arrival home
- Pack it in, pack it out. Do not leave any gut piles along the trail
- Bring a compass or GPS unit as these trails are not blazed.
- Motorized use of these trails is illegal
- The condition of the trails may vary from year to year (ex. Mowed, clear of downed trees) Note: maps are not to scale.
