Things you should know before you go.

- ❄ Christmas tree permits sell for \$5.00 each. We request you purchase only one permit per household.
- ❄ Permits can be purchased at any Umatilla National Forest Office or at many local area vendors. (Vendor list located on the back of brochure.)
- ❄ Christmas tree permits can also be used on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest **only** if accompanied by their printed information.
- ❄ A minor amount of bough material (up to 25 lbs.) can be removed for personal-use home decorating.

How to use your permit.

- ❄ Punch out the Month, Day, and Year from your Christmas Tree Permit
- ❄ Wrap the permit around the tree trunk, between limbs, and secure ends together with the accompanying plastic tie. Remember, once the permit is connected it cannot be undone without invalidating the permit.
- ❄ Keep the permit on the tree while in transit.

Be prepared for winter weather!

- ❄ Dress appropriately in warm, water resistant socks, boots, coats, hats and gloves
- ❄ Bring plenty of snacks and water
- ❄ Have supplies available to build a fire if necessary
- ❄ Make sure your vehicle is equipped for winter travel
- ❄ Tell someone where you're going and when you expect to be home

Where can you cut a Christmas tree?

The 2013 Christmas Tree Cutting Program on the Umatilla National Forest remains simple and easy to follow. The permit is valid on any Umatilla National Forest Ranger District lands when accompanied by this brochure. Please follow these few simple rules:

- ❄ **Do not cut on private land**, in wilderness areas, designated campgrounds, or existing tree plantations.
- ❄ Cut your tree **at least 50 feet away** from the road.
- ❄ Clean up any trimmings or limbs.
- ❄ Leave stumps no higher than 10 inches. It is illegal to "top" a tree.
- ❄ Cut off any green limbs left on the stump (these can be used later for decorating greens).
- ❄ The maximum height of a tree to be cut is 14 feet tall.
- ❄ Do not cut in active timber sales or areas that have been planted with new trees.
- ❄ Do not cut trees within 200 feet of Bluewood or Spout Springs Ski Areas, summer home sites, Tollgate Work Center, or Forest Service Guard Stations.
- ❄ Christmas tree cutting in the Tollgate Area on the Walla Walla Ranger District can be challenging after December 1, when most forest roads close for the winter. After December 1, snowmobiling or snowshoeing will be your only access into areas off State Highway 204.
- ❄ Christmas tree cutting on the Pomeroy Ranger District is prohibited on Park and Cook Ridges, and in the Lick Creek area, including Sheep Creek, Cabin, Capehorn and Mud Springs ridges.



Helpful hints. . .

- ❄ Carry your tree carefully out of the woods. Dragging the tree will rub off needles and bark.
- ❄ If the tree is too big to transport inside of your vehicle, wrap it in canvas to prevent wind damage.
- ❄ Once home, cut the bottom of the trunk off and place the freshly cut trunk in a bucket of water. Replenish water frequently.
- ❄ If storing your tree outside for a few days before putting it in the house, keep it in an area protected from the wind, such as the north or east side of your house or under a shaded tree.

What about after Christmas?

There are many local non-profit groups, boy scouts, etc. that collect Christmas trees for a nominal fee or donation. Call your local Chamber of Commerce or watch your area newspaper for more details.
