




Sawtooth National Forest 2015 Temporary Jobs



Listed below are temporary employment opportunities for the 2015 field season. A variety of jobs are available in archaeology, botany, fire, visitor service, range, recreation, timber, trails, minerals, equipment operators, and fisheries. The final number and types of positions filled will depend on staffing needs and budget. **Jobs will be available to apply for as early as December 2nd, 2014.**

Archaeological Technician

Position: GS-0102-07

The incumbent will participate as a member of the heritage program as an archaeological technician tasked with meeting program goals and objectives. The candidate will be involved in the completion of archaeological inventories for the identification and evaluation of heritage resources. The individual will also conduct documentation and assessment of archaeological sites and built historic features. The position will complete archaeological and architectural site monitoring to assess site integrity and define potential treats. In addition, the candidate will write National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), Section 106 reports that clearly present the findings and recommendations for the assessment of specific Federal undertakings. The position also supports the Forest Archaeologist in the completion of NHPA, Section 110 research. This includes providing guidance to volunteers working for the Forest Service in the completion of heritage program tasks. The candidate needs to have a strong grasp of archaeological principles and concepts to allow for the cognitive interpretation of archaeological research designs utilized on the Sawtooth National Forest. The position requires the individual to work in remote settings requiring camping and hiking in back country environments. The candidate will also need to provide adequate logistic support to accomplish the tasks assigned.

Biological Science Technician (Fisheries)

Position: GS-0404-04/05

The Forest will fill two GS-0404-04 or 0404-05 positions, one based in Stanley and one in Fairfield, to serve as the fisheries crew leader on a 3 person crew. As a crew leader, you will be responsible for supervising two SCA interns. These positions will assist with fisheries/aquatics management duties on the Forest and include both field (~85%) and office (~15%) work. Job duties include electrofishing and aquatic habitat surveys from June-September. Fisheries technicians typically assist with a variety of other inventories, monitoring, and restoration projects throughout the course of the summer. Assistance may also be provided to the wildlife and range crews.

The Forest will provide housing (\$4.20 per day) on each district where individuals are required to work. The selected individual will work 4-10 hour days (Monday to Thursday) each week. Monitoring will require working in remote locations in all types of weather. These positions will also require hiking over long distances (10 miles per day) carrying equipment weighing up to 40 lbs. over rough terrain. Overnight camping or backpacking over several days will be required in some locations. Experience working with stock animals (horses or mules) is desirable for the Fairfield position. Candidates must have a valid driver's license and have the ability to operate four wheel drive vehicles on rough roads.

*The individual in the GS-5 position working on the Sawtooth Wilderness, will act as a crew leader that directs, schedules, trains and mentors individuals in the GS-4 and GS-5 positions. The crew lead will also be responsible for data compilation and digital input. Duties for the team will include invasive plant, air quality, fish, amphibian, wildlife, dead and downed wood, user created impacts, and campsite surveys. Crew members work are expected to also work together as part of a close knit team, occasionally travelling independently. Crew members must have the skills to travel off-trail as well as on, across snow and rock in a Wilderness environment on multi-day 6-7 consecutive day assignments. Crew members work in remote settings in all kinds of weather, so a focus on personal as well as co-worker safety is essential. Travel is usually on foot carrying a backpack that contains personal as well as work supplies and tools. Sixty to 70 pound loads would be considered average. Overnight stays involve camping in a tent. Most of the work will be in the Sawtooth Wilderness but may occur in non-Wilderness backcountry settings.

Biological Science Technician (Noxious Weed Program)

Position: GS-0404-02/03/04 /05

These positions will serve as crew members of the Sawtooth NRA (in Stanley, ID) Ketchum Ranger District (in Ketchum, ID), or Fairfield Ranger District noxious weed program. Each crew will be supervised on a daily basis by a weed crew foreman. The job will entail spraying weeds via backpack sprayer, tank mounted UTV sprayer, and/or tank mounted truck sprayer. The positions will require rigorous physical demand because of factors such as steep terrain and inclement weather. Government housing is available in Featherville and limited amount of housing is available in Stanley, Ketchum and Malta, ID.

Biological Science Technician (Wildlife)

Position: GS-0404-04/05

The Minidoka District may fill one GS-404-04/05 position, based in Burley, ID, to work with the District Wildlife Biologist in the district wildlife program. This will be primarily a field position that requires work in remote locations in all types of weather. Some hiking over uneven terrain will be required. The work will involve light maintenance of wildlife structures such as wildlife waterers and small fence enclosures. The ability to use hands tools, power drills, and shovels is a necessity. There will be some data collection and monitoring of wildlife populations and habitat. Candidates must have a valid driver's license and have the ability to operate four wheel drive vehicles on rough roads.

Forestry Aid / Technician (Recreation)

Positions: GS-0462- 03 /04/05

The Aid position works primarily in campgrounds and dispersed recreation sites. The individual will clean facilities and maintain improvements such as picnic tables, restrooms, fire rings, fences, etc. The individual on occasion will interact with the public answering routine questions and checking compliance with rules and regulations. The individual works independently or on a small crew, and will be required to use hand tools and cleaning supplies.

The selected individual(s) for the Technician Position will assist in the daily management of dispersed and developed recreation areas. The incumbent will be expected to maintain and clean facilities such as campsites, dispersed recreation sites and outhouses and make visitor contacts to educate and enforce area regulations. They will be responsible for operating and maintaining all vehicles and tool associated with duties of the position. The selected individual will serve as a Forest Protection Officer (FPO) for the positions listed for Ketchum and Stanley. (The preferred candidate will have current FPO credentials and certification in first aid and CPR.)

Additional duties of this position include:

- Patrolling and monitoring recreation areas by vehicle, ATV, mountain bike, addressing issues as they arise.
- Monitoring the condition of facilities and resources, fixing, maintaining, and replacing items as needed.
- Participating in educational activities, answering questions, giving directions and working with visitors and other employees.
- Working with guides and outfitters to ensure compliance and provide information.
- Incumbent may be asked to respond to highway and land-based emergencies as well.

Individuals working on the Sawtooth National Forest can expect to perform their duties in a variety of weather conditions ranging from intense heat and sun to extreme cold with rain and snow. Applicants must be physically fit and at least 18 years of age. The incumbent will be working outdoors and may occasionally be required to spend the night in the field (sleep in tents and prepare meals in an outdoor environment). Bunkhouse facilities may be available but are not guaranteed. Work will be full time, 4-5 days/week, including weekends.

Forestry Technician (FPO/River Ranger)

Positions: GS-0462-04/05

The selected individual(s) will serve as a Forest Protection Officer (FPO) and assist in the daily management of the Upper Main Salmon River. This section of river is extremely sensitive due to the presence of four aquatic endangered species; Sockeye and Chinook salmon, Steelhead and Bull trout. The incumbent will be expected to maintain and clean facilities such as campsites, dispersed recreation sites and outhouses and make visitor contacts to educate and enforce area regulations. They will be responsible for operating and maintaining all vehicles and tool associated with duties of the position.

Additional duties of this position include:

- Patrolling and monitoring river resources via raft/kayak, addressing issues as they arise.

- Patrolling and monitoring land-based recreation areas by vehicle or ATV addressing issues as they arise.
- Monitoring the condition of facilities and resources, fixing, maintaining, and replacing items as needed.
- Participating in educational activities, answering questions, giving directions and working with visitors and other employees.
- Assisting with aquatic invasive species inspections and monitoring Chinook salmon spawning runs.
- Working with guides and outfitters to ensure compliance and provide information.
- Respond to river-based emergencies. Incumbent may be asked to respond to highway and land-based emergencies as well.

Individuals working on the Sawtooth National Recreation Area can expect to perform their duties in a variety of weather conditions ranging from intense heat and sun to extreme cold with rain and snow. Applicants must be physically fit and at least 18 years of age. The incumbent will be working outdoors and may occasionally be required to spend the night in the field (sleep in tents and prepare meals in an outdoor environment). Bunkhouse facilities may be available but are not guaranteed. Work will be full time, 4-5 days/week, including weekends.

The preferred candidate will be highly proficient operating rafts and/or kayaks on rivers with Class III and IV rapids. Additional preferred training: current FPO, first aid, CPR, and swift water rescue certifications.

Forestry Aid (Trail Crew) / Forestry Technician (Trails)

Position: GS-0462-03/04/05

The incumbent will independently perform a full range of standardized support duties specific to the trails program. The incumbent will use various tools and equipment to maintain and construct trails, install water-bars, and/or build rock walls. The incumbent will move or transport personnel and equipment to the project areas. The incumbent may perform independently or as a leader of one or more lower grade employees in maintenance or reconstruction of trail improvement projects. The incumbent will be working outdoors for extended periods of time. This will include living and working in an outdoor setting (sleep in tents and preparing meals in an outdoor environment), carrying heavy backpacks, tools and hiking long distances.

For the Forestry Technician Trail positions please highlight specialized trail experience including stock use, advanced trail building skills, leadership experience. One position in Fairfield will require an experienced back country motorcycle rider.

The incumbent may be required occasionally to explain and enforce forest rules and regulations. The incumbent may assist the unit by identifying and reporting additional resource needs or deficiencies.

Forestry Technician (Wilderness)

Position: GS-0462-05/06

Wilderness Rangers work and travel independently during their field hitches but are also expected to work together as part of a close knit team. A Ranger needs the skills and confidence to work alone, being self-reliant and self-sufficient while in a Wilderness environment on multi-day 4-6 consecutive day assignments. The selected individual(s) will serve as a Forest Protection Officer (FPO), making visitor contacts to educate and enforce forest rules and regulations. Rangers work in remote settings both on and off-trail, so a focus on personal as well a co-worker safety is essential. Travel is usually on foot carrying a backpack that contains personal as well as work supplies and tools. Fifty to 70 pound loads would be considered average. Overnight stays involve camping in a tent. Most of the work will be in the Sawtooth Wilderness and Boulder White Cloud mountains, but may occur in other non-Wilderness backcountry settings.

Individuals working on the Sawtooth National Recreation Area can expect to perform their duties in a variety of weather conditions ranging from intense heat and sun to extreme cold with rain and snow. Applicants must be physically fit and at least 18 years of age. Bunkhouse facilities may be available while not in the field at the Sawtooth Valley Work Center, but are not guaranteed. **The preferred candidate will have current FPO credentials.**

Preference will be given to candidates who demonstrate the following desired skills and attitudes: knowledgeable and proficient in backcountry travel; good communication skills to effectively interact with the public and co-workers; highly self-motivated. Additional preferred training: Current FPO credentials, trail maintenance, wilderness first responder.

Forestry Aid/Technician (Fire) – Hotshots, Helitack, Handcrew, Fire Engine, Prevention, Fuels

Position: GS-0462-03/04/05

Serves on crews performing duties in fire prevention and suppression. Performs prescribed burning crew duties in order to reduce fuel hazards and disease, while protecting wildlife. Assists with fire dispatch through operation of radios, telephones, and other necessary equipment to exchange information for fire weather and other forest suppression activities.

Lays or directs hose in the use of water. Moves dirt, chops brush, and fells small trees to build fireline using various hand tools such as axes, shovels, Pulaskis, and McLeods to control spreading wildland fire and/or to prepare lines prior to controlled burning. Chops, carries, and piles logging slash. Searches out and extinguishes burning materials by moving dirt, applying water by hose or backpack pump. Patrols fireline to locate and extinguish sparks, flare-ups, and hot spots that may threaten loss of control of the fire. Cleans, reconditions, and stores simple fire tools and equipment. Performs basic duties in support of fire, timber, silviculture, recreation, wilderness, or research programs, projects, or activities.

Forest Information:

The Sawtooth National Forest is 2.1 million acres and divided into four management units. Elevations range from 4,513 to 12,009 feet above sea level offering a great variety of topography and vegetation. The Forest extends from northern Utah to the Salmon River country in Idaho. The Forest contains four downhill ski areas, including the world-premiere Bald Mountain Ski Area at Sun Valley. At 217,088 acres, the Sawtooth Wilderness offers 250 miles of trails, 42 major peaks over 10,000 feet and 300 lakes.

Community Information:

Burley, Idaho

The population of Burley is approximately 10,000 and is a full service community. Population within the immediate vicinity approaches 20,000. Numerous schools, churches and shopping opportunities exist within the Mini-Cassia (Minidoka and Cassia County) area, along with Cassia Regional Medical Center and Minidoka Memorial Hospital. Housing in Burley is very reasonable and would be considered cheap compared to other areas of the west. Burley is located just 35 miles from Twin Falls, which has a regional airport and most major shopping outlets. Situated along the Snake River the City of Burley provides access to the 20 miles of the most approachable shoreline of the entire river. Located on both the south and north sides of the river, this access offers many opportunities for water sports and fishing. The city also has numerous parks and recreational facilities, including two golf courses. Burley serves as the major shopping center for the Mini-Cassia area. A temperate climate, beautiful scenery, numerous recreations opportunities that can be enjoyed without the large crowds typical of larger urban areas make this a desirable place to live. Government housing may be available in Malta, Idaho approximately 30 miles from Burley.

Stanley, Idaho

Stanley is a remote rural community with a base population of 100, located at the foothills of the awesome Sawtooth Mountains. It is known for its excellent recreation opportunities; hiking, mountain biking, fishing, camping, hunting, white water rafting and kayaking, snowmobiling, snowshoe adventures, and cross country skiing. The climate can be extreme. Snow may extend from November through mid-May with temperatures dropping to -20(F) degrees for a week or so in January. Ketchum is a 4 season resort community located in the heart of the Wood River Valley. The communities of Hailey, Bellevue and Sun Valley lie within close commuting distance to the city of Ketchum. The Wood River Valley is a full service area, with an excellent school system serving grades K-12. Medical services exist in both Hailey and Ketchum, in addition to one hospital and numerous medical clinics offering many types of specialized physicians. Shopping exist for all necessary goods, and can be done locally. In addition to the resort atmosphere at Sun Valley, the local area provides many cultural events including top musical artists, sporting events and art/music festivals. World Class outdoor recreation opportunities exist generally within 30-45 minutes of anyone living in the valley and include; alpine skiing and snowboarding on the legendary Sun Valley Resort "Bald Mountain", over 160 kilometers of Nordic ski trails, thousands of acres of snowmobiling opportunities, hundreds of miles of single track mountain biking, hiking and motorcycle trails, incredible fishing opportunities in the Salmon River, Big Wood, Big Lost and world famous Silver Creek and excellent bird and big game hunting opportunities. Government housing will be available at the Ketchum Ranger District Bunkhouse.

Fairfield, Idaho

The Fairfield Ranger District is approximately 400,000 acres with lots of back country opportunities. The District maintains over 400 miles of trails (hiking, horseback and motorized), numerous campgrounds and plenty of recreational opportunities. Winter recreation is also very popular, we have over 50 miles of groomed snowmobile trails with endless backcountry opportunities and Soldier Mountain ski hill is located 12 miles north of town.

Fairfield is located on a high prairie and experiences all four seasons. Winters last about six months and can be cold and snowy. Summers are warm, with highs in the 90's and very little rainfall, great for camping and getting into the back country. Fairfield is a quiet rural Idaho town with a population of approximately 450.
