How to Apply:

1. Go to www.USAJobs.gov
 2. If you are a first time user you will have to create a profile or login using your current USAJobs login information.
 3. Click on: RESUME. Enter your information to build a resume or up-load your own.
 4. After your resume is ready, you can apply for jobs. Find jobs by searching for any of the following parameters:
 - a. Specific pay grade range
 - b. Series specification - 0462
 - c. Job title: Trails
 5. Select Position you wish to apply for:
Example: Forestry Aid (Recreation)
Forestry Tech (Trails)
Forestry Tech (YCC Crew Leader)
 6. You can save jobs you have found in your search.
 7. Make sure the Announcement number is EXACT and you choose the correct duty station—or you have not applied to the correct job and will not show up on the applicant list.
 8. Follow the steps to complete the online application, being sure to read each question carefully and answering completely.
 9. Submit your application and check back from the home page under "Application Status".

USA Jobs REMINDERS *

- Print and save all login usernames and passwords for your future use.
- Saving your information does not mean you have applied for a job - only that you have a profile and have entered application information.
- MAKE SURE you click on the apply button to submit your application.
- Enter or update all required questions and resume information.
- Make sure to apply for ALL GS levels you may qualify for, even if it's a lower GS than you would like to ensure you certify on the hiring list.
- Each position or grade level you are applying for requires a separate application - one application for the same position at different locations.

Working Conditions

Forest Service employees have to love to work and live out-doors. Working for the forest service requires working in areas that could be very remote, sleeping in tents from time to time and inter-acting with large wild animals in their habitat. The work varies from building bridges, sawing out trails, monitoring ATV trails use, painting picnic tables, building fences and putting up signs to giving directions and helping visitors.

Forest service employees often work to help each other enhance fuels, facilities, wildlife, range & recreation projects. Forest Service employees hike in steep terrain, carry heavy loads, and do demanding physical work for long hours. They work in the extremes - hot, cold, rain, snow and smoky conditions.
