2. This permit is accepted subject to the conditions set forth herein.

3. The United States of America shall not be liable for any damage incident to the performance of work under this agreement to any depositors or landowners who are parties to the agreement.
4. The holder shall indemnify the United States against any liability for damage to life or property arising from the occupancy or use of National Forest lands under this permit.
5. The holder, in exercising the privileges granted by this permit, shall comply with the regulations of the Department of Agriculture and all Federal, State, County, and municipal laws, ordinances, or regulations which are applicable to the area or operations covered by this permit.
6. The holder shall take all reasonable precaution to prevent and suppress forest fires. No material shall be disposed of by burning in open fires during the closed season established by law or regulation without a written permit from the Forest Officer in charge or his authorized agent.
7. The holder shall exercise diligence in protecting from damage the land and property of the United States covered by and used in connection with this permit, and shall pay the United States for any damage resulting from negligence or from the violation of the terms of this permit or of any law or regulation applicable to the National Forests by the holder, or by any agents or employees of the holder acting within the scope of their agency or employment.
8. Disorderly or otherwise objectionable conduct by the holder or those occupying the premises with permission shall, upon proof thereof, be cause for termination of this permit and the denial of any such subsequent permit.
9. No fireworks shall be transported, stored or used on the land covered by this permit or in the structures thereon.
10. This permit is not transferable.
11. The holder shall pack out or otherwise remove from National Forest lands and waters all refuse resulting from operations under this permit, except combustible materials may be burned in stoves or incinerators provided for this purpose.
12. The holder shall carry on all operations in a skillful manner, having due regard for the safety of employees; and shall safeguard with fences, barriers, fills, covers, or other effective devices, pits, cuts, and other excavations which otherwise would unduly imperil the life, safety, or property of other persons.
13. The holder shall take reasonable precautions to prevent pollution of or deterioration of lands or waters which may result from the exercise of the privileges extended by this permit. In particular, the holder shall at all times comply with applicable local, State, and Federal requirements for pollution abatement. Failure of the holder to so comply may result in termination or suspension of this authorization.
14. The permittee shall maintain the improvements and premises to standards of repair, orderliness, neatness, sanitation, and safety acceptable to the Forest Officer in charge.
15. In the event of any conflict between any of the preceding printed clauses or any provisions thereof and any of the following clauses or any provisions thereof, the following clauses will control.

INTERMOUNTAIN REGION RECREATION LODGING APPLICATION

Permits for use of recreation lodging in the National Forests of the Intermountain Region are issued on either a "first-come, first-served" basis, or by lottery up to 180 days in advance of intended use. Permits may be obtained in person or by mail. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age. Your signature on the maintenance agreement on back will allow us to use the permit receipts to maintain Guard Stations. **Return the application and signed agreement to the District Ranger.**

Permits will be made out to the intended user(s) and the permit must be with the user during the time of occupancy.

The maintenance charge is shown on the back. **Please make check or Postal Money Order payable to USDA-Forest Service.** Payments by Credit Card may also be made at the Ranger Station or on the phone (801) 798-3571. Payments must be made prior to use of the recreation lodging. Refunds will not be made of the amounts paid.

NOTICE: There are certain unusual and inherent hazards associated with the use and occupancy of facilities under this program, the risks of which the user will assume all responsibility. Full information in this regard is available from the District Ranger.

DIAMOND FORK GUARD STATION INFORMATION

Location: The Diamond Fork Guard Station is located 26 miles from the Spanish Fork Ranger District Office, Spanish Fork, Utah.

The recommended route to the Guard Station is through Spanish Fork, Utah. The Guard Station is 26 miles from Spanish Fork Ranger District Office up Highway 6; Take the Diamond Fork Road (FS Road 029) off of Highway 6, follow Diamond Fork Road up to Springville Crossing. Take FS Road 058 north to the Guard Station.

Alternative Routes:

27 miles from Spanish Fork Ranger District Office up Right Fork of Hobble Creek Canyon (FS Road 058).

Or 36 miles from Spanish Fork Ranger District Office up Highway 6 and up the Sheep Creek Road (FS Road 051, connect to FS Road 058).

FILL OUT THE CONDITION REPORT PROVIDED ON ARRIVAL AND UPON DEPARTURE

Beds: There are two bunk beds; one with a full size bunk, one twin size bunk. Mattresses are included. There is also a day bed. Each person should bring a sleeping bag and a pillow.

Rooms: The Guard Station has one small bedroom (with the 2 bunk beds), and one large kitchen/living room (with the day bed). A Restroom is to the west of the Guard Station.

Services: Drinking water and electricity are NOT available. The oven and stove top, run on propane. There is no refrigerator or lighting. There is a wood burning stove in the living/kitchen area. All garbage must be packed out.

Wood Stove: Must provide your own wood (there is no dead and down wood around area). The Guard Station has a good wood stove. Keeping warm should not be a problem. Rather, the problem is getting the Guard Station too warm. Before you start a fire, light some crumpled up newspaper to warm the flue and get a good draft going. Start a fire and be patient as the Guard Station warms up. Resist the temptation to build a large fire. Use the screw in the damper on the front of the stove to regulate heat. Crack the stove door a little before fully opening the door to minimize smoke. Be safe with the stove at all times.

Cooking Utensils: There are no cooking accessories nor utensils available. Please bring your own.

Toilet: The outside toilet may need to be shoveled clear of snow to open the door. Some toilet paper is provided but plan on bringing a roll or two (depending on your length of stay and the number of people in your group).

Cooking Stove: The pilot light is already lit. Turn any burner knob on high for the burner to quickly light. If burners do not light within 5 seconds, lift top cover of the stove to relight pilot light.

Lights: There are no lights in the Guard Station. Bring your own light source for inside. All indoor lighting must be run by battery or solar power. **No open flames are allowed inside the Guard Station.**

Sink: You may use it to pour water down. There is not in-sink disposal. Do not put any solids down the drain. Please flush well when using the dry sink.

Bears: Utah is Black Bear Country so keep food and garbage unavailable to bears to protect them and yourself. Put your cooler inside your car at night and don't store food outside. See the brochure on bears in the 3-ring binder for more information.

Pets: Pets are NOT allowed at the Diamond Fork Guard Station.

NO SMOKING IS ALLOWED INSIDE OF THE GUARD STATION

BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE GUARD STATION

Wash and clean up the kitchen.

Don't add wood to the stove before you leave. Give the stove a chance to cool off while you are still there.

If you have used the sink, flush well with water before leaving.

Check that the gas stove is turned completely off.

Sweep the floor as clean as possible. A broom and push vacuum are next to the back door.

Ensure ashes in the outside fire pit are out cold.

Pack up your garbage and take it with you.

Close and lock the doors. Make sure the toilet door is closed tightly. Please lock the drive way gate.

Drive safely.

Return the condition report to the Ranger Station or leave on the kitchen table, and any suggestions you might have to us.
