

RULES OF USE

A California Department of Fish & Wildlife Fishing License is required to fish at Loveland Reservoir. All County, State and Federal regulations will be enforced.

To preserve natural habitats, maintain water quality and protect visitors, the following restrictions will be enforced:

 NO LIVE FRESHWATER BAIT OR BAIT BUCKETS

 NO DRONES

 NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

 NO FIRES OR SMOKING

 NO BOTTLES OR GLASS CONTAINERS

 NO DOGS, HORSES OR PETS
(PER STATE WATER BOARD CODE)

 NO BICYCLES OR MOTORIZED VEHICLES

 NO BOATS, CANOES, OR FLOAT TUBES

 NO SWIMMING OR WADING

 NO FISH CLEANING

 NO FIREARMS, BOWS, CROSSBOWS OR AIR GUNS

 NO LITTERING OR DUMPING

Fishing access is limited to posted areas. Please stay in designated areas and respect the sensitive environment at Loveland Reservoir.

Hours of operation vary by season. The program is subject to closure on major holidays and at any time due to Red Flag Warnings, elevated fire conditions, inclement weather or any other safety concerns.

ABOUT LOVELAND RESERVOIR

Loveland Reservoir is owned and operated by Sweetwater Authority (Authority), a public water agency. The reservoir stores water used to produce drinking water for approximately 200,000 people in Chula Vista, National City and Bonita, California.

To protect and preserve water quality and the natural habitat, in 1997 the Authority and the USDA Forest Service established a partnership providing public fishing access along a portion of the shoreline that extends up to 5 miles when the reservoir is full. This partnership preserved natural habitat and forest lands available to San Diego County and Southern California residents and wildlife.

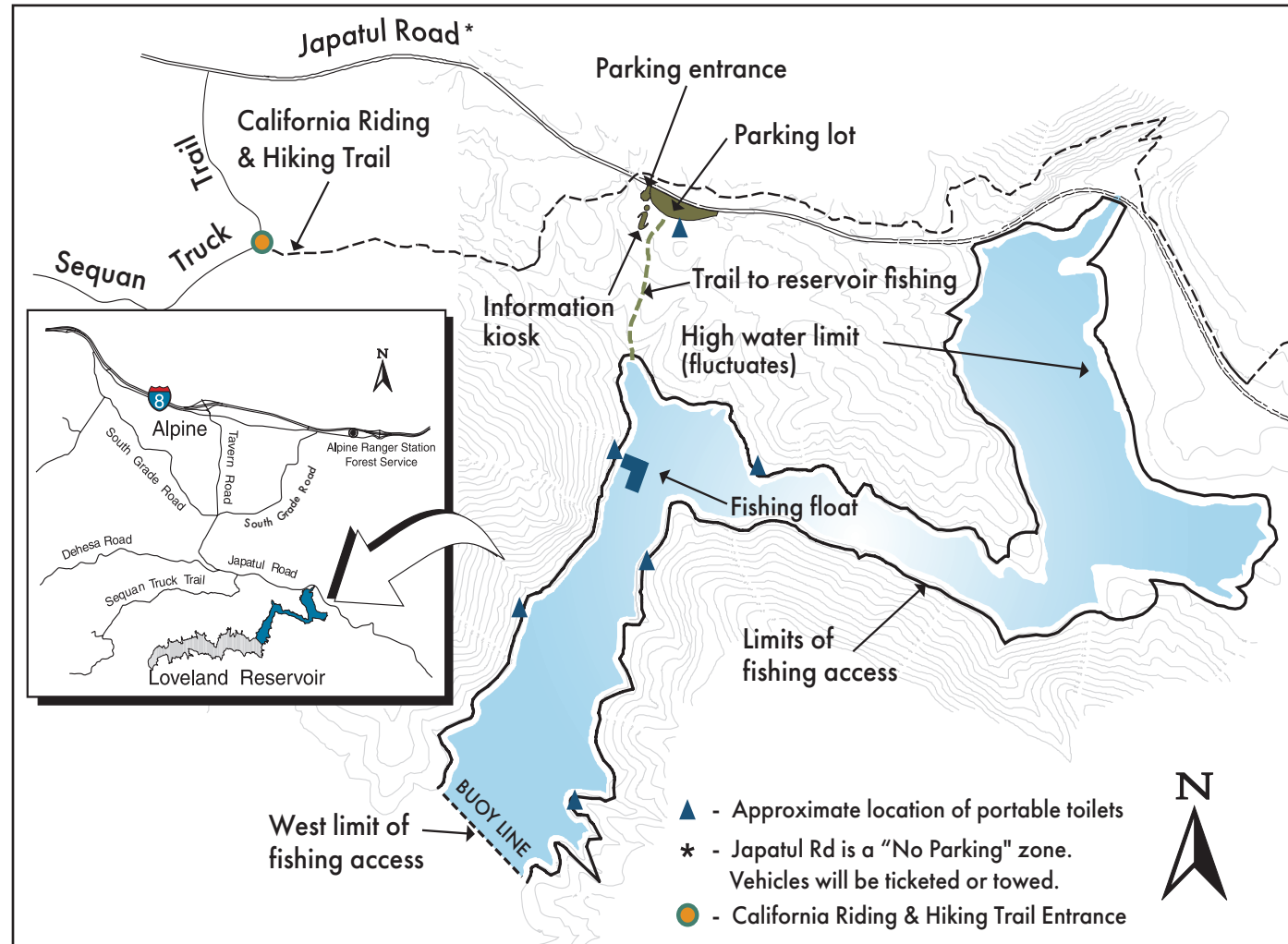
Please respect the sensitive environment present at the reservoir. It is illegal to collect or disturb any artifacts found in the area.

FISHING INFORMATION

Fishing activities at Loveland Reservoir are designed to protect public health and benefit the community. Activities will be monitored by the Authority.

- All visitors must stay in designated areas.
- Fishing access is limited to posted areas and is limited to 50' above the high water mark.
- Discharge of human waste in or around the reservoir is a violation of state law.
- Adult supervision is required for children under 16 years old.
- Rattlesnakes are found in the area, so please use caution to avoid any contact.
- There are no concessions or potable water at this facility.
- There is no day use fee, however a California Department of Fish & Wildlife Fishing License is required.

FISH LIMITS

- Catfish: 5
- Bluegill: 25
- Bass: 5 (12" minimum length)
- Red-Eared Sunfish: 25
- Crappie: 25
- Combined Bluegill, Sunfish & Crappie bag limit: 25

NOTICE: To prevent the further spread of quagga mussels, **NO LIVE FRESHWATER BAIT** including shiners & crawdads. The ban does not apply to mealworms, redworms, or crickets.
