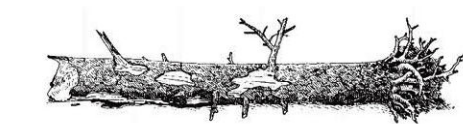

When cutting, gathering, or transporting fuelwood:

This map, the Motor Vehicle Use Map, and fuelwood tags are a part of your woodcutting permit and must be in your possession while cutting, gathering and transporting your wood.

FUELWOOD CUTTING CONDITIONS

When is Cutting allowed?

- Woodcutting areas are open year round except for special Forest ordered closures and/or fire requirements as specified under the daily PAL Restrictions (see other side of this map for PAL details).

Where is Cutting allowed?

Cutting is allowed in areas coded as "Open" on the Fuelwood Cutting Map, with the following exceptions:

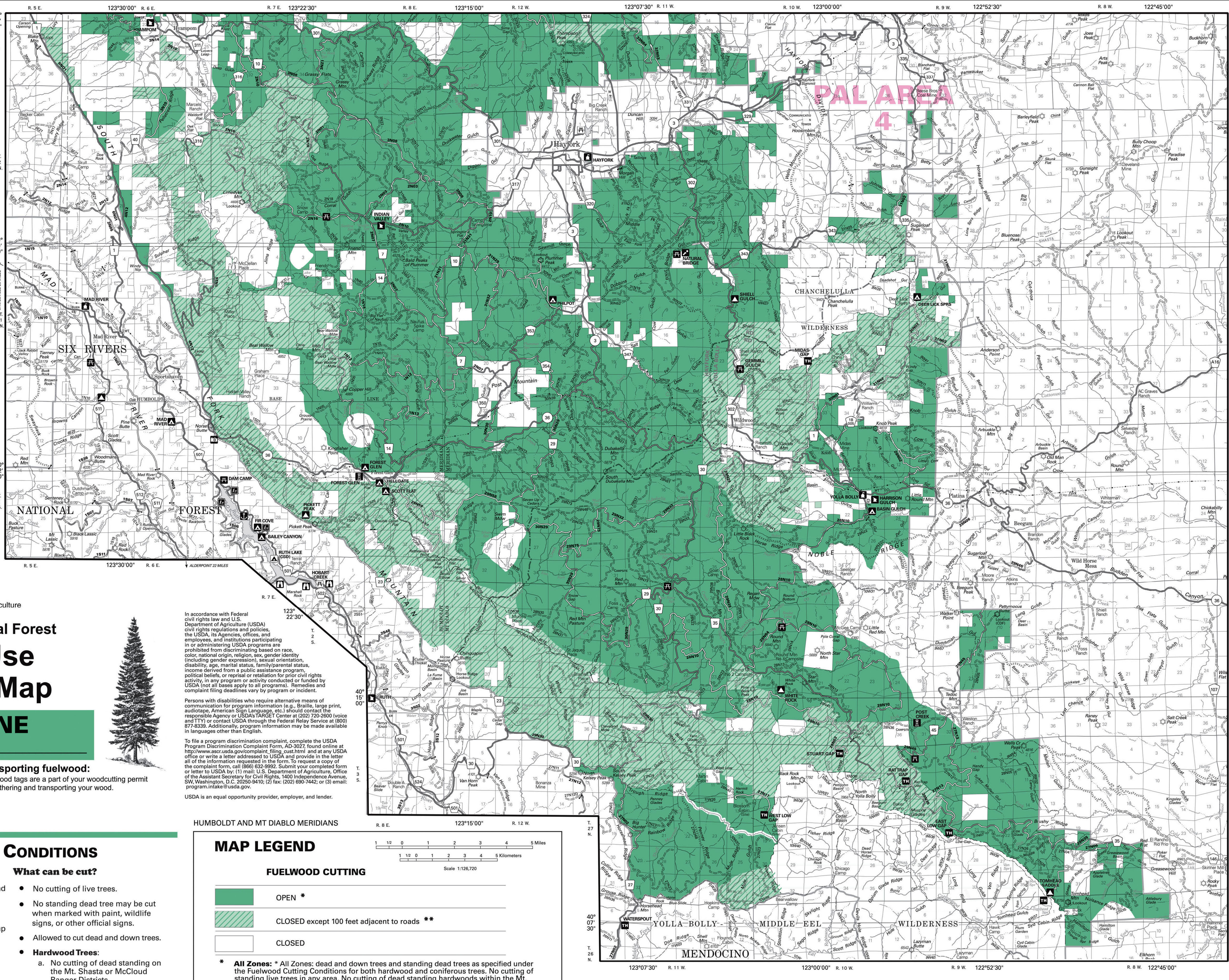
- Administrative sites, active timber sales areas, developed recreation areas and posted "no woodcutting areas" are closed to all fuelwood cutting.

- No woodcutting within 300 feet of streams or 150 feet of ponds lakes or wet areas.

What can be cut?

- No cutting of live trees.
- No standing dead tree may be cut when marked with paint, wildlife signs, or other official signs.
- Allowed to cut dead and down trees.
- Hardwood Trees:**
 - No cutting of dead standing on the Mt. Shasta or McCloud Ranger Districts.
 - Allowed to cut any standing dead hardwoods 15 inches or less in diameter (measured at 12" stump height) from July 1 through October 15.
- Coniferous Trees:**
 - Allowed to cut any standing dead conifer 15 inches or less in diameter (measured 4.5' from ground) within woodcutting areas designated on map.

Motorized vehicles are permitted only on existing roads and motorized trails that are designated for motor vehicle use as shown on the Motor Vehicle Use Map.

* **All Zones:** * All Zones: dead and down trees and standing dead trees as specified under the Fuelwood Cutting Conditions for both hardwood and coniferous trees. No cutting of standing live trees in any area. No cutting of dead standing hardwoods within the Mt. Shasta and McCloud Ranger Districts. No cutting of any standing dead tree if marked with paint, wildlife signs, or other official signs in any area. Refer to the Motor Vehicle Use Map to ensure compliance with motor vehicle use regulations.

** In these areas, **National Forest System Roads designated for travel are OPEN to FUELWOOD CUTTING** for dead and down trees up to a distance of 100 feet adjacent to each side of the roadway on National Forest System lands. No cutting of standing live or dead trees is allowed. Refer to the Motor Vehicle Use Map to ensure compliance with motor vehicle use regulations. Cutting operations within the 100 foot areas adjacent to these roads are subject to all other woodcutting conditions and requirements of the Personal Use Fuelwood Map and a valid Fuelwood Cutting Permit as issued. **All open roads are shown on the Motor Vehicle Use Map.**
