This Map and Christmas tree cutting tag are a part of your Christmas Tree Cutting Permit and both must be in your possession while cutting and transporting your tree.

Christmas Tree Cutting Conditions














1. Cutting or removing any tree with a main stem exceeding 6 inches in diameter at ground level is prohibited
2. Cutting any tree in or within 100 feet of any administrative or developed site is prohibited, ie: campground, picnicking, or day use areas, etc.
3. Collecting, taking, possessing, or transporting any part of a tree without a valid permit is a federal offense, and violators will be prosecuted.
4. Cutting any tree is prohibited within 100 feet of the outer edge of designated roads.
5. Not all roads shown are authorized for motor vehicles. To ensure compliance refer to the motor vehicle use map (MVUM).

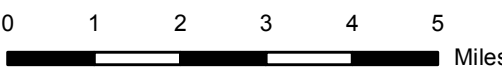
 Designated roads, prohibited cutting within 100 feet measured from outer edge of road.
