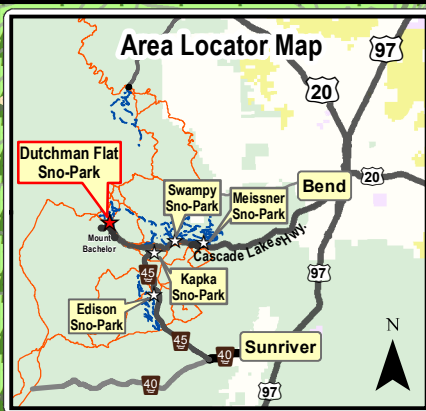


Dutchman Flat Sno-Park Ski/Snowshoe Trails

Area and Trails Closed to Dogs

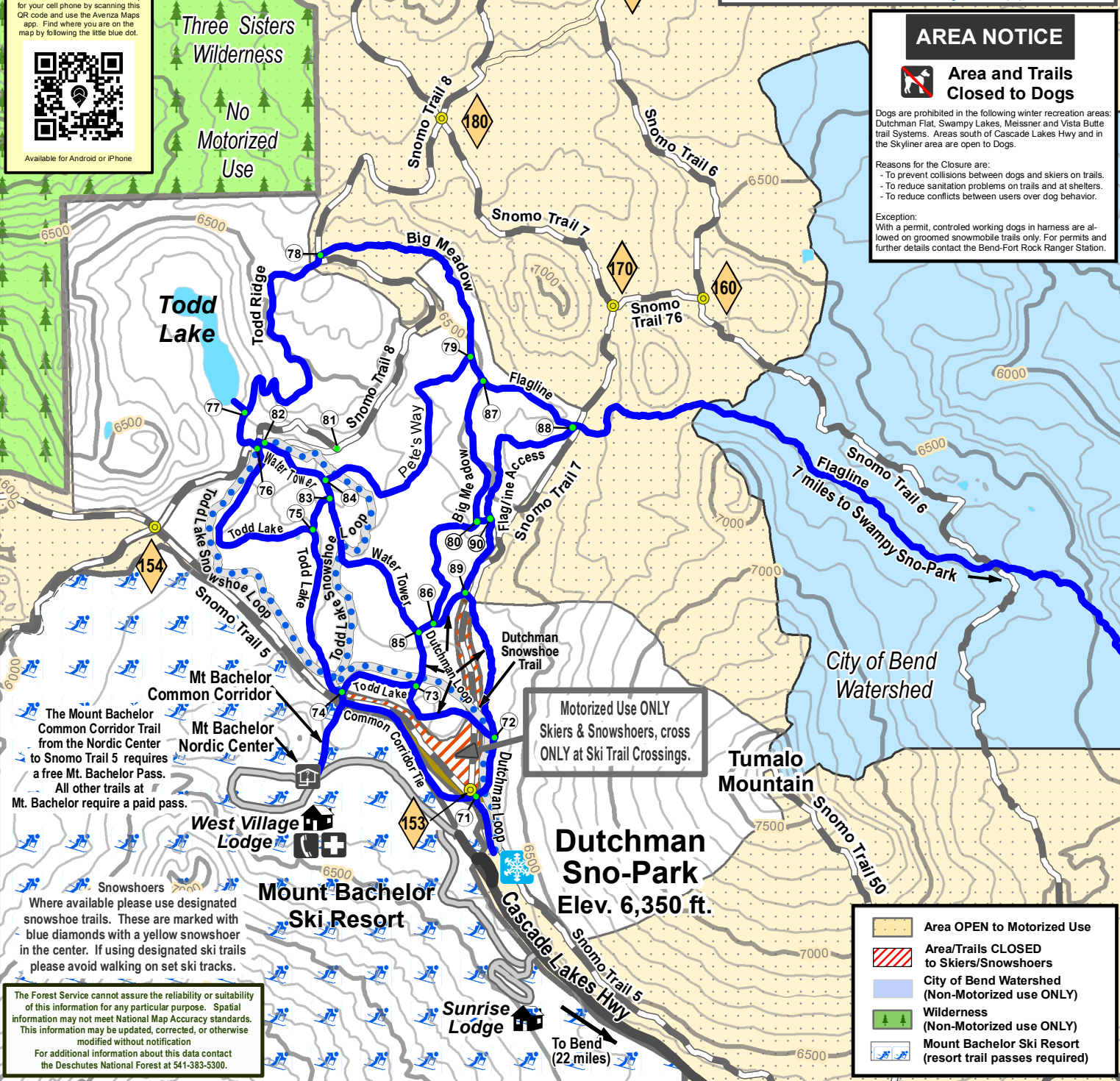
Dogs are prohibited in the following winter recreation areas: Dutchman Flat, Swampy Lakes, Meissner and Vista Butte trail Systems. Areas south of Cascade Lakes Hwy and in the Skyliner area are open to Dogs.

Reasons for the Closure are:

- To prevent collisions between dogs and skiers on trails.
- To reduce sanitation problems on trails and at shelters.
- To reduce conflicts between users over dog behavior.

Exception:

With a permit, controlled working dogs in harness are allowed on groomed snowmobile trails only. For permits and further details contact the Bend-Fort Rock Ranger Station.



The Mount Bachelor Common Corridor Trail from the Nordic Center to Snomo Trail 5 requires a free Mt. Bachelor Pass. All other trails at Mt. Bachelor require a paid pass.

Motorized Use ONLY
Skiers & Snowshoers, cross ONLY at Ski Trail Crossings.

- Area OPEN to Motorized Use
- Area/Trails CLOSED to Skiers/Snowshoers
- City of Bend Watershed (Non-Motorized use ONLY)
- Wilderness (Non-Motorized use ONLY)
- Mount Bachelor Ski Resort (resort trail passes required)
