

**Order**  
**National Forest System Roads and Trails**  
**Wallowa-Whitman National Forest**

Pursuant to 36 CFR Section 261.50 (a) and (b), until further notice, the following acts are prohibited within the below listed areas on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest.

1. It is prohibited to possess or use a vehicle off National Forest System roads. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to use or possession of motorized vehicles off National Forest System roads and off National Forest System trails in the areas and at the times described in Appendix A and I of this order. (36 CFR 261.56).
2. It is prohibited to possess or use a vehicle off National Forest System roads. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to use or possession of motorized vehicles off National Forest System roads and off National Forest System trails in the areas and at the times described in Appendices B through G of this order, except for the purposes of going to and from campsites when such campsites are located within 300 feet of an open National Forest System road. (36 CFR 261.56).
3. Using any motorized vehicle prohibited by the order. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to all National Forest System roads within the areas and at the times described in Appendices A through J of this order including those roads listed in the perimeter description, except as noted in the appendices. (36 CFR 261.54(a)).
4. Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to all motorized vehicles on National Forest System trails within the areas and at the times described in Appendices A through G of this order including those trails listed in the perimeter description, except as noted in the appendices. (36 CFR 261.55(b)).
5. Landing of aircraft, or dropping or picking up any materials, supplies, or person by means of an aircraft, including a helicopter. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to all Appendices of this order. (36 CFR 261.58(y)).
6. Going into or being upon any area which is closed for the protection of public health or safety. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to Appendix J of this order. (36 CFR 261.53 (e)).

***THIS ORDER SUPERSEDES THE SECTIONS OF ORDER #233 PERTAINING TO THE WHITMAN RANGER DISTRICT.***

The following people are exempt from this order (36 CFR 261.50(e)):

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of emergency official duties.

## APPENDIX A

CLOSED YEARLONG TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES EXCEPT ON ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW AND OVER-SNOW VEHICLES OPERATING ON 12 INCHES OR MORE OF SNOW ON OPEN ROUTES LISTED BELOW.

1. NORTH FACE: The area west of Granite, Oregon beginning at the junction of the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Forest Road 73) and County Road 24 and proceeding west and south along Road 24 down Granite Creek and up Clear Creek to the junction with Road 1900 at the confluence of Clear Creek and Beaver Creek; thence along Road 1900 up Beaver Creek to Road 1900690; thence northerly along Road 1900690 to Road 7375160; thence west along Road 160 to Road 7300755 near the boundary of Unity and Baker Ranger Districts; thence east along Road 7300755 to Road 7300760 at the boundary with public and private lands; thence west and north around the boundary to the junction of the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Forest Road 73) and County Road 24, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Forest Roads #7300755, 760 and 7375160 are open to over snow vehicles operating on 12 inches or more of snow but closed to all other vehicles.

2. SOUTH SHORE/PHILLIPS LAKE: The area on and around Phillips Lake beginning at the junction of Highway 26 and Hudspeth Lane proceeding east along Highway 26 to the junction of Road 1145 thence south along Road 1145 to the Idaho Power Company power transmission line thence westerly along the power line to the ridge top at the junction of Road 1145292 thence southwesterly up the ridge line to highest elevation at 5078 feet thence northwesterly down the ridgeline to the junction of Roads 2220 and 2220300, thence westerly along Road 2220 to the boundary of public and private land near the junction of Road 460, thence along the boundary of public and private land in a westerly and northerly direction to the point of beginning at junction of Highway 26 and Hudspeth Lane.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Forest Roads 1145, 1145400, 2220, 2200200, 2200300, 2200310, 2200400, 2220480, 2220485, 2220460, 2230 and all its spurs, and watercraft operating on the Lake surface. **2220020**

## APPENDIX B

CLOSED YEARLONG TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES EXCEPT OVER-SNOW VEHICLES OPERATING ON 12 INCHES OR MORE OF SNOW FROM DECEMBER 1 TO JUNE 30 AND ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW. GREEN DOT COOPERATIVE CLOSURE AREA.

1. SUMMIT POINT: The area between the Eagle Cap wilderness boundary and Summit Point beginning at Summit Point Lookout and proceeding southeast along Road 7715 to the junction with Road 7715160, thence east along Turner Creek to the property boundary with private and public land, thence north along the

property boundary to Road 4190150, thence north along Road 150 to Road 4190200; thence west along Road 200 to Trail 1868, thence northwesterly along Trail 1868 to the ridge line at the head of Jim Fisk Creek, thence up the ridgeline to Cornucopia Peak at the Eagle Cap Wilderness boundary, thence southwesterly along the wilderness boundary to Trail 1946, thence southwesterly along Trail 1946 approximately 2 miles to the end of the ridgeline, thence south to the junction of Roads 7732150 and 7732210, thence easterly along Road 7732150 to the junction with the end of Road 7725046, thence easterly along Road 7725046 to Road 7725042, thence southeasterly along 7725042 to Road 7725, thence easterly along Road 7725 to Road 7725150, thence easterly along Road 7725150 to Road 7725170, thence easterly along Road 7725170 to the end of the road, thence due east across Conundrum Creek to Summit Point Lookout, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 7725, 7725046, 7725042, 7732150 (mile post 0.0-2.5), 7715

2. MELHORN RESERVIOR: The area between the Eagle Cap wilderness boundary and the Fish Lake Road beginning at Twin Lakes and proceeding southwesterly along Road 6600 (Fish Lake Road) to Road 6600200, thence west along Road 6600200 to the end of the Road, thence due north across East Pine Creek to the end of Road 6620, thence west about 1 mile along Road 6620 to a point due east of the Clear Creek Trailhead, thence west to the Clear Creek Trailhead, thence northerly along Clear Creek to the crossing of Trail 1867, thence due east across the ridge top at elevation 7027 feet to the end of Road 6610200, thence south along Road 6610200 about 1 mile to the ridge top at 6560 feet elevation, thence west down the ridge line to the property boundary of private and public lands, thence north and west following the property boundary to Trail 1880 thence north along Trail 1880 to the crossing bridge, thence due west to Cornucopia Peak, thence north and east along the Eagle Cap Wilderness boundary to Twin Lakes, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Fish Lake Road 66, Russell Mountain Lookout Road No. 6600450, Fish Lake Campground Road No. 6600400, 6600410 to the Deadman trailhead, Road 6600500 to Twin Lakes Campground, Trail 1887 Trailhead, Road 6620 to earthen berm at mile post 5.5, Roads 6610200, and all access roads to private lands.

## APPENDIX C

CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES FROM DECEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 15 EXCEPT ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW.

1. EAGLE CREEK: The area of big game winter range between Eagle Creek and Summit Creek beginning at the confluence of Eagle Creek and Basin Creek and proceeding southeasterly along Eagle Creek to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest boundary near the confluence with Skull Creek, thence south and east along the National Forest boundary to Road 7700, thence northwesterly along Road 7700 to the boundary with private lands, thence west and north around the boundary to Road 7700101 thence westerly along Road 101 to Road 7741, thence

west along Road 7741 to Road 7741175, thence north along Road 7741175 about 2 miles to Road 7739100, thence northwesterly along Road 7739100 to Road 7739, thence westerly along Road 7739 to private property boundary, thence westerly along the private boundary to Road 7735450, thence westerly along Road 7735450 to the property boundary of public and private lands, thence west and north around the property boundary to Road 7735490, thence northwest along Road 7735490 to 7737150, thence west along Road 7737150 to Road 7737, thence northwesterly along Road 7737 to Road 7735, thence west along Road 7735 to Basin Creek thence down Basin Creek to Eagle Creek, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 7735, 7739, 7737, 7737150 (mile posts 0.0 to .2 miles), and 7700.

2. SALMON CREEK—The 480 acres of big game winter range near Salmon Creek administered by the Forest Service in the south half of Section 8 and the south east quarter of Section 7 in T. 9 S., R. 39 E., W.M.

**OPEN ROUTES:** No open routes.

## APPENDIX D

CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES FROM 3 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF FIRST RIFLE BULL ELK SEASON THROUGH THE CLOSE OF THE SECOND RIFLE BULL ELK SEASON EXCEPT FOR ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW. GREEN DOT COOPERATIVE CLOSURE AREAS.

1. TRAIL CREEK The area between the North Fork John Day River and Chicken Hill beginning at the junction of the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Forest Road 73) and the Ukia Road (Forest Road 52) at the North Fork John Day Campground and proceeding north along Road 52 to the junction with Road 51 near the confluence of South and North Trail Creeks; thence west along Road 52 to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest boundary; thence north along the forest boundary to the boundary of private and public land near Trout Creek; thence east and north following the private land boundary back to the forest boundary; thence northeasterly along the divide between Davis Creek and Sheep Creek which is the boundary between La Grande and Baker Ranger Districts to the junction of Grande Ronde River Road 51 and 5185; thence easterly along Road 5185 to the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Forest Road 73), thence south and west along the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Forest Road 73) to the North Fork John Day Campground; the place of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 51, 52, 73, 7325010, and 5185.

2. INDIAN-GORHAM The area between Antone Creek and Anthony Creek beginning at Anthony Lakes and proceeding north on the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Forest Road 73) to the junction with the Ladd Canyon Road (Forest Road 43); thence north along Road 43 to the junction with Road 4380; thence east along Road 4380 to Road 7312; thence northeast along Road 7312 to Road 7312190;

thence east along Road 7312190 (and nearby Anthony Creek) to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest boundary with the Elkhorn Wildlife area; thence south along the forest boundary with the Elkhorn Wildlife Area and with private lands to Road 73 near Antone Creek; thence westerly along Road 73 to Anthony Lakes; the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 7302, 7302020, 7312, 7312065 to Sand Flats, 7320 to gate at mile post 2.08, 7320050, 7300160 and 7300161 accessing the summer homes, 7300179 and 7300180 accessing the campgrounds, 43, 4380, 73.

3. CLEAR CREEK The area of the Clear Creek and Wolf Creek drainages south of the district boundary between the La Grande and Whitman Ranger District (old Baker RD). From the eastern forest boundary between sections 9 and 10, T.5 S. R. 38 E. along Forest Road (FR) 4300160 to the junction with FR 4320, along FR 4300170 to the Ladd Canyon Road (FR 43) proceeding west along Road 43 to the La Grande Watershed boundary; thence south along FR 4300 to FR 4330; thence south and east along Road 4330 to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest boundary west of the junction with Road 4316; thence north and east, south and east, north and east, and north about 11.5 miles along the forest boundary to FR 4300160, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Road 43, 4300160 and 4300020 loop, 4315, 4316, portion of 4320 in front of gate with ROAD CLOSED sign, 4320038 from Summit Springs to forest boundary, and 4330.

## APPENDIX E

CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES FROM THREE DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF RIFLE DEER SEASON THROUGH THE CLOSE OF THE LAST ELK SEASON AND FROM MAY 1 THROUGH JULY 1 EXCEPT FOR ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW. GREEN DOT COOPERATIVE CLOSURE AREA.

1. OKANOGAN-FISH The area between the Fish Lake Road (Forest Road 66) and the Wallowa Mountain Loop Road (Forest Road 39) beginning at the junction of Road 66 and 6600285 and proceeding southeasterly to Trail 1871; thence southeast along Trail 1871 to Road 3990162; thence easterly along Road 162 to Road 3390160; thence easterly along Road 160 to Road 3990130; thence east along Road 130 to Road 3990; thence east along Road 3990 to the end of the Road; thence east and south along the ridge top between Fall Creek and Lake Fork of North Pine Creek to the North Pine Rest Area on Road 3900 (the Wallowa Mountain Loop Road); thence south along Road 39 to Road 3990; thence west and north along Road 3990 to Road 3992; thence westerly along Road 3992 to Road 6628; thence westerly along Road 6628 to Road 6625; thence north and east along Road 6625 to Road 66 near East Pine Creek; thence north and east along Road 66 to the junction of Road 66 and 6600285, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Road 39, 3990, to the gate at Grouse Flats in T. 7 S., R. 47 E., W.M., Section 4, 3990060, 3992, 3992180 to a gate near the junction of 185, 3994, 66, 6625 and 6628.

2. PATRICK CREEK The area south of Whitney beginning at the junction of Road 1040 and the North Fork Burnt River Road (County Road 529) near Antlers Guard Station and proceeding north along Road 529 to the boundary of public and private lands near Whitney Meadow; thence west and north along the private land boundary around Whitney Meadow to the North Fork Burnt River near County Road 503B; thence west along the North Fork Burnt River (excluding private lands) to the Journey Through Time Scenic Byway (State Highway 7); thence south and west along State Highway 7 to the boundary between the Wallowa-Whitman and Malhuer National Forests; thence southeasterly along the ridge top and National Forest boundary to Road 1940040 near the headwaters of Mosquito Creek; thence east along Road 040 to Road 1940 near Mosquito Spring; thence northeast along Road 1940 to County Road 529 near Antlers Guard Station; thence north along County Road 529 to the junction of Road 1040 , the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** State Highway 7, County Roads 529 and 503B, Forest Roads 1040, 2620, and 1940. Forest Road 1040 is closed from May 1 to July 1.

## APPENDIX F

CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES FROM THREE DAYS PRIOR TO THE  
OPENING OF RIFLE DEER SEASON THROUGH THE CLOSE OF THE LAST ELK  
SEASON EXCEPT FOR ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW. GREEN DOT  
COOPERATIVE CLOSURE AREA

1. DARK CANYON The area around Dooley Mountain beginning at Dooley Summit on State Highway 245 and the junction of Forest Road 1100 and proceeding east on Road 1100 to Road 1100020 near the headwaters of Ebell Creek; thence south on Road 020 to Road 1100070; thence south about 0.2 miles to the boundary of Forest Service and BLM administered lands near the headwaters of French Gulch; thence south and east along the administrative boundary crossing Dark Canyon, Auburn Creek, Glasgow Gulch and Mill Creek where it intersects State Highway 245; thence northerly along State Highway 245 to Dooley Summit and the junction with Road 1100, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** State Highway 245, Roads 11, 1100020, 1100070, and portions of the 1110, 1115, 1118, and 1100150 not behind ROAD CLOSED signs.

## APPENDIX G

CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES FROM THREE DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF ARCHERY SEASON THROUGH THE CLOSE OF THE LAST ELK SEASON AND FROM MAY 1 THROUGH JULY 1 EXCEPT FOR ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW. GREEN DOT COOPERATIVE CLOSURE AREA.

1. LAKE FORK-DUTCHMAN The area between Fish Lake and North Pine Creek beginning at the junction of the Fish Lake Road (Forest Road 66) and 6600285 and proceeding north and east along Road 66 to the Wallowa Mountain Loop Road (Road 39) near the confluence of Duck Creek and North Pine Creek; thence south along Road 39 to the North Pine Rest Area; thence west and north along the ridge top between Fall Creek and the Lake Fork of North Pine Creek to the terminus of Road 3990; thence west along Road 3990 to Road 3990130; thence east along Road 130 to Road 3990160; thence westerly along Road 160 to Road 3990162; thence westerly along Road 162 to Trail 1871; thence northwest along Trail 1871 to Road 6600285; thence west along Road 285 to the Fish Lake Road (Forest Road 66), the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 39 and 66, Lake Fork Campground Road 3900750 and Lake Fork Trailhead Road 3900700.

## APPENDIX H

CLOSED DURING THE SKI SEASON TO ALL MOTOR VEHICLES EXCEPT SNOW GROOMING EQUIPMENT.

1. ANTHONY LAKES BASIN The area around Anthony Lake beginning at the Elkhorn Scenic Drive (Road 73) and Road 7300180 near the base of the Anthony Lakes Ski Lift and proceeding southwest along a straight line to the mountain peak at the end of Road 7300185; thence southeast along Trail 1618 following the divide between Angell Basin and Crawfish Cove to Angell Peak; thence north along Trail 1611 to the Elkhorn Trailhead at Road 73; thence west along Road 73 to Road 7300180, the place of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 73, 7300184.

## APPENDIX I

### AREA CLOSED TO ALL MOTOR VEHICLES JANUARY 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31.

1. WEST FORK BURNT RIVER The area with Bald Eagle nests west of Unity Reservoir beginning at the junction of Road 1905 and Road 1900 near Dooley Gulch Pond and proceeding south along Road 1900 to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest Boundary; thence west and south along the forest boundary with private lands, crossing Road 2624 near the West Fork Burnt River, to the ridge top between the West Fork Burnt River and Thompson Gulch at elevation 4327 feet; thence west along the ridge top between the West Fork Burnt River and Thompson Gulch passing through high points at elevations 4404 feet ,4549 feet, crossing Road 2695, to a point at the highest elevation at 4867 feet, thence north on a line crossing the West Fork Burnt River at the intersection of Road 1905 and Road 2624; thence northeast along Road 1905 to Road 1900, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Roads 1900, 1905, 2624, and 2695.

**NOTE:** The 300-foot corridor is not open to motor vehicle entry.

## APPENDIX J

### CLOSED YEARLONG TO ALL PUBLIC ENTRY EXCEPT FOR ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW.

1. BAKER CITY WATERSHED The area east of the Elkhorn Crest from Goodrich Creek to Elk Creek beginning at Marble Pass Trailhead and proceeding northwest along the top of the Elkhorn ridge to Elkhorn Peak; thence north and east along the ridge top between Pine Creek and Goodrich Creek to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest boundary at the Pipeline Road 7140200; thence south and east along the Pipeline Road, crossing Marble Creek Road 6510, to a gate near Little Salmon Creek; thence east, south and west following the section lines between Sections 20 and 17,21,29 to Section 30; thence south along the line between Sections 30 and 29 to Elk Creek; thence southwest along a fence line on the ridge in Section 31 to Road 7220088 on Elkhorn Ridge; thence northwest along Elkhorn Ridge to Marble Pass Trailhead, the point of beginning.

**OPEN ROUTES:** Road 6510, and 7140220 to the Road Closed sign.
