

OHV Guide-Mt Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest

- All vehicles operated on national forest system roads must be: HIGHWAY LEGAL in accordance with Washington state laws.
- Registered, and have license plates, insurance, turn signals, taillights, and headlights.
- Off-road vehicles such as quads, dirt bikes, three-wheelers, tracked vehicles or snowmobiles are NOT considered highway legal.
- Forest Service code of federal regulations prohibits offroad vehicles on national forest system roads, through forest, or from damaging vegetation.

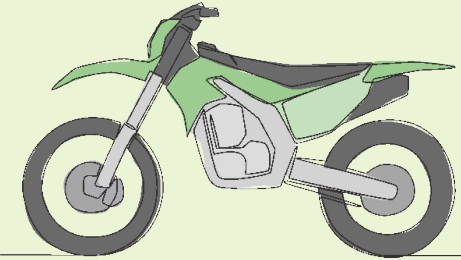
The following trails allow dirt bike and motorcycle use seasonally:
