Setting The Stage

Enforcement of Federal laws and regulations, on National Forest lands, is the responsibility of the U.S.D.A. Forest Service. However, State and local law enforcement agencies have the same authorities and responsibilities on National Forest lands as they do elsewhere in their respective jurisdictions.

The Carson cooperates to the fullest extend possible with the various federal, state, county and local agencies within or adjacent to the Forest.
