Designation of a road, trail, or area for motor vehicle use by a particular class of vehicle under 36 CFR 212.51 should not be interpreted as encouraging or inviting use, or to imply that the road, trail, or area is passable, actively maintained, or safe for travel. Motor vehicle designations include parking along designated routes and at facilities associated with designated routes when it is safe to do so and when not causing damage to National Forest System resources. Seasonal weather conditions and natural events may render designated roads and trails impassable for extended periods. Designated areas may contain dangerous or impassable terrain. Many designated roads and trails may be passable only by high-clearance vehicles or four-wheel drive vehicles. Maintenance of designated roads and trails will depend on available resources, and many may receive



# CAMPING

This motor vehicle use map identifies those roads, trails, and areas designated for the motor vehicle use under 36 CFR

212.51 for the purpose of enforcing the prohibition at 36

only and are not subject to designation under the Forest

Motor vehicle use off of designated roads or trails for the purpose of dispersed camping is permitted for up to 300 feet from the open road travelway.

### **PARKING**

Motor vehicles may be parked within one vehicle length from the edge of the road surface when it is safe to do so without causing damage to NFS resources or facilities, unless prohibited by state law, a traffic sign, or an order (36 CFR261.54).

The designation of a trail includes the width of the trail and, to promote public safety, the distance necessary to allow other users to pass where it is safe to do so without causing damage to NFS resources or facilities.

### **Motorized Cross Country Travel**

Motor vehicle use off of designated roads for recreationa day use is permitted for up to 300 feet from the open road travelway except in areas shown as restricted on the map. In the Hells Canyon NRA there is NO areas open for Cross Country travel beyound 300 feet from an open road travelway.


### **PROHIBITIONS**

It is prohibited to possess or operate a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands on the Wallowa Whitman National Forest other than in accordance with these designations (36 CFR 261.13).

Violations of 36 CFR 261.13 are subject to a fine of up to \$5,000 or imprisonment for up to 6 months or both (18 U.S.C. 3571(e)). This prohibition applies regardless of the presence




Designated roads, trails, and areas may also be subject to temporary, emergency closures, and visitors must comply with signs notifying them of such restrictions. 
