

# Errata 3

---

## Background

Since the publication of the White River National Forest Land & Resource Management Plan 2002 Revision and the accompanying Final Environmental Impact Statement and related documents, several typographical errors and needed corrections have been found. These errors do not substantively change the information presented and do not affect the decision. This errata sheet will be updated as new errors are found.

Errata direction for maintenance of forest plans formulated under the 1984 Planning direction follow 36 CFR 219.31 Maintenance of the plan and planning records.

## Species of Viability

The *Braya glabella* and *Draba globosa* need to be placed on the Plant Species of Viable Concern list. These two species appear in different sections of the Forest Plan that refer to Plant Species of Viable Concern, but not consistently. To correct this both the smooth rockcress (*Braya glabella*) and rockcress draba (*Draba globosa*) are to be added to (if not all ready) Goal 1c.16 on page 1-6 of the Goals section of the Forest Plan; to Standard 1 under the Forest-wide Standards for Species of Viable Concern, Plant on page 2-24 of the Forest Plan; and to Appendix EE on page EE-4 of the Forest Plan.

## Beaver Creek Ski Area

To correct a topographical error the boundary of 8.25 is to be revised slightly for the Beaver Creek ski area. Due to scale, this was not reflected in the original mapping. The topology follows the Beaver Creek Ski Area connection to the Arrowhead Ski Area. See attached map. Topographical errors for non-substantive change follows direction found in 36 CFR 219.31 (3).

## Lower Battlement Mesa RNA

To correct a legal error the boundary of 2.2 RNA for Lower Battlement Mesa is to be revised slightly to exclude V Road – a Mesa County Road. The Forest Service does not have the right to change the rights, easements, rights-of-way for this road. This was not reflected in the original mapping. RNA's cannot include public roads as it interferes with the intent of the RNA and subsequent direction for RNA's. The RNA boundary therefore will be 300 feet off of centerline from V Road to reflect the new RNA boundary. The area north west of the new boundary that is National Forest System land becomes Management Area 5.41 – Winter Elk Range. The area to be transferred to Management Area 5.41 equals 31 acres from the 24,449 acre RNA leaving 24,418 acres to the RNA. See attached map.
