GOOSEBERRY & GREAT WESTERN TRAILS INFORMATION 2023

GOOSEBERRY #1 (Willow Creek)

This trail begins at Hwy 89 north of Salina at 5,126 feet above sea level and continues east up the Willow Creek Road to its highest point of 8,984 feet at the junction with the Great Western Trail. It winds through sagebrush lowlands, up through oak, mahogany, pinyon and juniper, then tops out in mixed conifer and aspen. This route is open to all vehicles and has a green rating of easy. There is a restroom and trail information along this route at Anthony Flat.

GOOSEBERRY #2 (Salina Creek)

This trail begins at the Acord Lakes/Convulsion Canyon Road (Gooseberry #9) at 6,818 feet above sea level and continues north up the Salina Creek Road to its highest point of 8,993 feet at the junction with the Great Western Trail. It winds up through Salina Creek Canyon adjacent to the stream for several miles then leaves the pinyon/juniper to climb into mixed conifer and aspen. This route is open to all vehicles and has a green rating of easy. There is parking and trail information at the beginning of the route, as well as a restroom, parking and information at the Salina Creek Second Crossing Trailhead.

GOOSEBERRY #3 (Water Hollow)

This trail begins at the junction of Water Hollow and the I-70 frontage road (Gooseberry #9) at 6,167 feet above sea level and continues north up Water Hollow Canyon to Anthony Flat (Gooseberry #1). The highest point on this route is just north of the northern Great Western Trail Junction at 8,525 feet. It winds up through pinyon/juniper country to mixed conifers and aspen. This route is open to all vehicles and has a green rating of easy. There is a restroom and trail information just past the northern end of this route on Gooseberry #1 at Anthony Flat.

GOOSEBERRY #4 (Little Redmond)

This trail begins just southeast of Anthony Flat on the Water Hollow Road (Gooseberry #3) at 7,737 feet above sea level and continues east to the junction with the Great Western Trail to its highest point of 8,898 feet. This route traverses through mixed conifer and aspen. The route is open only to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. There is a restroom and trail information just north of the western end of this route on Gooseberry #1 at Anthony Flat.

GOOSEBERRY #5 (Steve's Basin)

This trail begins along the Willow Creek Road (Gooseberry #1) at 6,170 feet above sea level and continues south, then east to junction with the Great western Trail. The highest point of this route reaches 7,880 feet, winding through pinyon/juniper, gamble oak, mountain mahogany and a short section of mixed conifer/aspen. The route is somewhat steep and rocky but still has a blue rating of more difficult and is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width. There are no trailheads or restrooms along this route.

GOOSEBERRY #6 (Rattlesnake)

This trail begins along the I-70 frontage road (Gooseberry #9) at 5,657 feet above sea level and continues north to the junction with Gooseberry #5 in Steve's Basin. The highest point of this route is 7,065 feet at the Gooseberry #5 junction. This trail climbs through some spectacular red and white rock country popping out into some old chainings then through pinyon/juniper. The route is somewhat steep and rocky but still has a blue rating of more difficult and is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width. There are no trailheads or restrooms along this route.

GREAT WESTERN TRAIL (north of I-70)

This route begins at the I-70 Great Western Trailhead at 5,771 feet above sea level. The trail proceeds north through Pinyon/Juniper and Oak to Water Hollow Road (Gooseberry #3) where the route takes a slight turn south. After just over a mile the route turns north east and continues over Bull Valley Mountain and across Dead Horse Ridge and up to the Manti-Lasal NF Boundary. You will venture through mixed conifer and aspen on the northern part of this route where it reaches its highest point of 9,327 feet. The majority of this route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. The only restroom along the route is at the I-70 Trailhead.

GOOSEBERRY #7 (Brown's Hole)

This route begins at the Gooseberry Road/ Brown's Hole Road junction at 8,692 feet above sea level. The highest point along this route is 8,922 feet. The route begins in aspen and mixed conifer then descends through gamble oak and pinyon /juniper. The first part of this route is open to all vehicles. The lower half of the trail is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a black diamond rating of most difficult due to rocky and steep, winding switchbacks. A short section of this trail provides visitors a unique experience of feeling like you are driving through a tunnel of oak. The Brown's Hole Trailhead with restroom, parking and trail information is near the beginning of this route.

GOOSEBERRY #8 (Niotche/Flat Top/Antone Hollow)

This route begins at the junction with Gooseberry #7 at 8,164 feet above sea level. The highest point along this route is 9,177 feet along Flat Top mountain. The route travels down through Antone Hollow to Niotche Creek where you can stop for lunch at a picnic table. You will climb out of the lower country through gamble oak and ascend into aspen and high meadows. This route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and had a blue rating of more difficult. There are no restrooms along this route but the Niotche Trailhead is located just one mile north on the Great Western Trail from the south end on this route.

GOOSEBERRY #9 (Frontage Road)

Thiis route begins on the I-70 frontage road at the junction with the Paiute 01 at 5,429 feet above sea level. The route continues east for many miles to the Ivie Creek Rest Area. The highest point on this route is 7,940 feet. You will parallel I-70 through some deep canyons, through a couple of tunnels and through many types of habitats including river, rock ledges, pinyon/juniper, gamble oak, cottonwood and mixed conifer. There is parking and restrooms at the I-70 Trailhead and Ivie Creek Rest Area. Trail Information and parking are provided at Salina Creek (Gooseberry #2) and Tommy Hollow (Gooseberry #17). This route is open to all vehicles and has a green rating as an easy route.

This route begins at the Gooseberry Road near the Gooseberry Campground at 7,839 feet above sea level. This route climbs through Gamble oak, Pinyon /Juniper and Aspen to its highest point of 8,487 feet at the junction with the Oak Ridge Road (Gooseberry #11). This route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a black diamond rating as most difficult. The nearby Gooseberry Campground is open to OHV's.

This route begins at the Sheep Creek Trailhead at 8,320 feet above sea level and proceeds east through Gamble oak and snowberry to the Great Western Trail junction. The highest point along this route is 8,891 feet at the junction with the Great Western Trail. The route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. Restrooms, parking and trail information are available at the Sheep Creek Trailhead

GOOSEBERRY #13 (Farnsworth/Gates Lake)

This route begins at the Great Western Trail junction just north of the Niotche Trailhead at 8,972 feet above sea level. The route proceeds west and south through aspen, meadows, mixed conifer and spruce-fir passing Farnsworth Reservoir and Gates Lake. The highest point along this route is 10,409

feet. Most of the route is open only to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. Restrooms, parking, picnic tables and trail information are available at the Niotche and Gates Lake Trailheads. There are also restrooms and trail information in the Cold Spring, Harves and Farnsworth dispersed camping areas.

GOOSEBERRY #14 (UM Pass)

This route begins on the Gooseberry / 7-Mile Road at the junction with Gooseberry #13 at 10,360 feet above sea level. The route proceeds south then turns east over UM Pass, the highest point on this route at 10,531 feet, and down towards Black Flat to the Great Western Trail junction. The first half of this route is open to all vehicles and rated as easy. The last half of this route has a black diamond (most difficult) rating and is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width. This route provides views of high mountain peaks and beautiful meadows travelling though aspen, mixed conifer and spruce-fir. There is a restroom, parking and trail information available just south of the end of this route on the Great Western Trail at the Black Flat Trailhead. Parking and trail information is also available at the Cold Spring Trailhead near the junction with Paiute Side Trail #56.

GOOSEBERRY #15 (Humphrey's Spring)

This route begins on the Gates Lake Road at the junction with Gooseberry #13 at an elevation of 10,291 feet above sea level, which is the highest point on this route. The route proceeds south though meadows, spruce fir and mixed conifer to the junction with Paiute Side Trail #56. The route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. There is parking and trail information near the south end of this route at the Cold Spring Trailhead.

GREAT WESTERN TRAIL (from I-70 Trailhead south to Black Flat Trailhead)

This route begins at the I-70 Great Western Trailhead at 5,771 feet above sea level. It proceeds south through pinyon/juniper, Gamble oak, aspen, mixed conifer, spruce-fir and open meadow. The highest point along this route is 10,809 feet at Yogo Pass. This is the highest point on the Fishlake National Forest section of the Great Western Trail. Most of this route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. There are five trailheads along this route with restrooms, parking and trail information (I-70, Oak Ridge, Brown's Hole, Niotche and Black Flat). There are picnic tables located near Maple Spring and Yogo Pass and a trail information kiosk at Yogo Pass.

GOOSEBERRY #16 (Sheep Valley)

This route begins just south of Sheep Valley with the junction of the Great western Trail at 9,418 feet above sea level. The route makes a loop through Sheep Valley traversing through aspen, mixed conifer, spruce-fir and open meadows reaching a maximum high point of 9,983 feet. This route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and is rated blue for more difficult.

GOOSEBERRY #17 (Tommy Hollow)

This route begins in Sheep Valley at 9,282 feet above sea level which is the highest point on the route. Leaving the junction with Gooseberry #16 the route descends east down Tommy Hollow through aspen, mixed conifer, Gamble oak and pinyon/juniper terminating at the junction with Gooseberry #9 on the I-70 frontage road. The route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and has a blue rating of more difficult. There is a trail information kiosk at the junction with Gooseberry #9.

GOOSEBERRY #18 (Meadow Gulch)

This route begins near Sheep Valley with the junction of Gooseberry #16 at 9,652 feet above sea level. This is the highest point on this route. It descends north down Meadow Gulch going through aspen, mixed conifer, Gamble oak and pinyon/juniper. The route is open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and rated as black diamond for most difficult.

GOOSEBERRY #19 (Red Creek)

This route begins at the Great Western Trail Junction near the top of Red Hole at an elevation of 9,959 feet above sea level. This is the highest point on the route. It then proceeds down the Red Creek drainage through aspen, mixed conifer, brush and pinyon/juniper to the terminus at the Gooseberry #9 (I-70 frontage road). This route is open to all vehicles and has a blue rating of more difficult.

GOOSEBERRY #20 (Kinney Meadow/Clear Creek)

This route begins at the Great Western Trail junction approximately 1.5 miles east of Mount Hilgard at an elevation of 9,408 feel above sea level. This is the highest point on the route. From this junction, the route descends through Kinney Meadows near John's Peak then drops north into the Clear Creek drainage and east to Gooseberry #9 (I-70 frontage road). This route is open to all vehicles and has a green rating for easy.

GREAT WESTERN TRAIL (from Black Flat Trailhead to Hogan Pass)

This route begins from the Black Flat Trailhead at 9,408 feet above sea level and proceeds north and east around Mount Hilgard then continues south to Hogan Pass. You will travel at elevations above 10,000 feet for much of this route reaching a maximum height of 10,360. Most of this route traverses through alpine meadows, aspen, mixed conifer and spruce-fir. GREAT WESTERN TRAIL (Thousand Lakes Mountain Section)

This route starts from Hogan Pass Trailhead at 8,960 feet above sea level and proceeds south and east around Geyser Peak to Riley Spring. This section provides incredible views down into Meek's Lake and farther east into the San Rafael Swell. From Riley Spring the route continues south wrapping around the west side of Hens Hole Peak to Elkhorn Campground reaching the highest point on the route of 10,070 feet, just south of the Neff's Trail Junction. From Elkhorn you will continue south around the east side of Thousand Lakes Mountain observing some spectacular scenery with breathtaking views into Capitol Reef National Monument. The route will descend through Sulfur Basin and down through some red rock desert in sand Wash, then west across the Velvet Ridges to Bicknell Bottoms. This route has two sections that are open to vehicles 50 inches or less in width and the rest is open to all vehicles. The route is rated as blue for more difficult. There are restrooms, parking and trail information at Hogan Pass, Riley Springs, Elkhorn, Torrey and Bicknell Bottoms Trailheads.

GREAT WESTERN TRAIL (Boulder Mountain Section)

This trail section begins at the Bicknell Bottoms Trailhead at 6,937 feet above sea level and continues south past Aquarius Ranger Station on to Boulder Mountain, terminating at Row Lakes. The highest point along this route is 10,465 feet just north of Row Lakes. The trail begins climbing through rocky desert wash country then transitions into pinyon/juniper and brushland. As you near Aquarius Ranger Station the landscape begins to change again with aspen and mixed conifer appearing. As the route continues south into the higher country of the Boulder Plateau spruce and fir become the dominant trees with a scattering of aspen mixed within. Several sections of this route are limited to vehicles of 50 inches or less in width. It has a blue rating of more difficult.
