Location	From Clovis: Take highway 168 toward Huntington Lake. At the Eastwood Visitor Center turn right on Kaiser Pass Road (Forest Road 80). Travel 17 miles to the "Y". Continue left toward Edison Lake (Forest Road 5S80) approx. 2.75 miles to Bear Off Highway Vehicle Route (OHV). The trailhead is opposite of the OHV Route on the west side of the road. Look for a sign that states "Mono Hot Springs Trail".

Season	June through October (snow conditions permitting)
Quota	Daily Advanced Reservation: 6 Daily "Walk-Ups": 4
Trailhead Facilities	Nearby camping,
Nearby Campgrounds	Mono Creek
Permits	Yes. Permits are required for overnight camping in wilderness areas.
Reservations	Yes. Wilderness permit reservations are available at www.recreation.gov . Trailhead quotas are in place year-round. For all trails, 60 percent of the trailhead quota is available through advanced reservation 6 months prior to entry date and 40 percent is available 2 weeks prior to entry date, for first come-first served. There is a \$6.00 non-refundable reservation fee and a \$5.00 charge for everyone included in the reservation.

Wilderness Grazing	Pack stock grazing is permitted in most wilderness areas as weather and seasonal conditions permit. For the latest grazing regulations please contact the High Sierra Ranger Station in Prather at 559-855-5355
Campfire Regulations	No fires permitted above 10,000 feet. The wilderness permit includes the campfire permit. An innovative method for building a Leave No Trace fire is to pack a portable fire pan (a simple metal tray with rigid sides at least three inches high). Metal oil drain pans and pans from backyard barbecue grills are effective and inexpensive fire pans. Fire pans may also be purchased at outdoor sporting goods stores. A campfire permit is required for overnight camping at the trailhead.
Food Storage	This is bear country. It is important to use the most effective food storage methods to protect yourself and your food/refuse from unnecessary bear encounters. Two proven methods acceptable in the

	Sierra Nevada Wilderness Areas include the use of an approved bear canister or the counter balance methods. Pets	Domestic pets are allowed in the Ansel Adams Wilderness Area. Wilderness visitors are responsible for their pet's actions and welfare. Pets should be leashed and under direct voice control. When camping or hiking in areas with other visitors, pets must be kept on a leash. Please Note: Adjacent National Parks do not permit pets.
