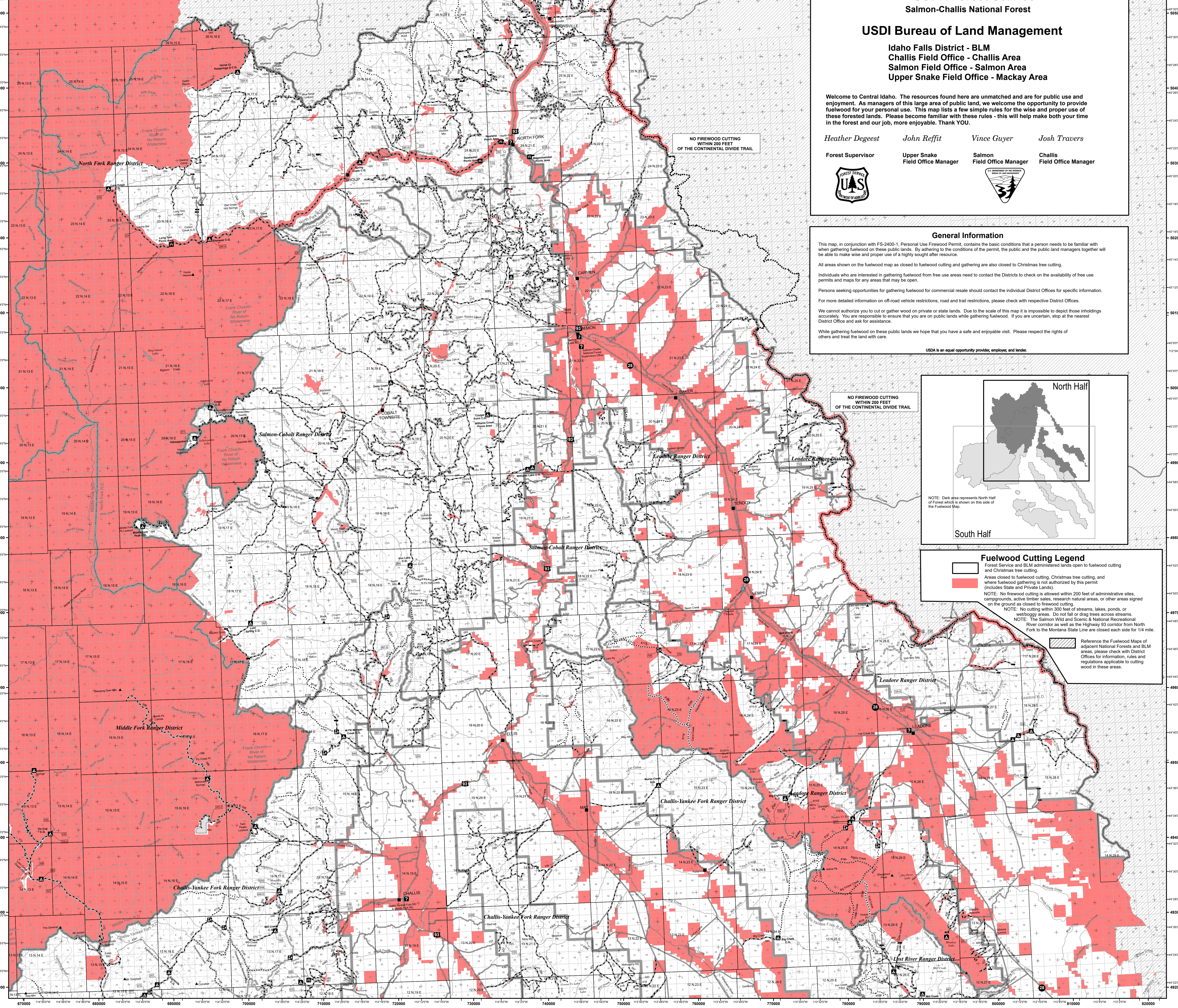

General Information

This map, in conjunction with FS-2400-1, Personal Use Fuelwood Permit, contains the basic conditions that a person needs to be familiar with when gathering fuelwood on these public lands. By adhering to the conditions of the permit, the public and the public land managers together will be able to make wise and proper use of a highly sought after resource.

All areas shown on the fuelwood map as closed to fuelwood cutting and gathering are also closed to Christmas tree cutting.

Individuals who are interested in gathering fuelwood from free use areas need to contact the Districts to check on the availability of free use permits and maps for any areas that may be open.

Persons seeking opportunities for gathering fuelwood for commercial resale should contact the individual District Offices for specific information. For more detailed information on off-road vehicle restrictions, road and trail restrictions, please check with respective District Offices.

We cannot authorize you to cut or gather wood on private or state lands. Due to the scale of this map it is impossible to depict those inholdings accurately. You are responsible to ensure that you are on public lands while gathering fuelwood. If you are uncertain, stop at the nearest District Office and ask for assistance.

While gathering fuelwood on these public lands we hope that you have a safe and enjoyable visit. Please respect the rights of others and treat the land with care.

NOTE: Dark area represents North Half of Forest which is shown on this side of the Fuelwood Map.

Fuelwood Cutting Legend

- Forest Service and BLM administered lands open to fuelwood cutting and Christmas tree cutting.
- Areas closed to fuelwood cutting, Christmas tree cutting, and where fuelwood gathering is not authorized by this permit (includes State and Private Lands).
- NOTE: No firewood cutting is allowed within 200 feet of administrative sites, campgrounds, active timber sales, research natural areas, or other areas signed on the ground as closed to firewood cutting.
- NOTE: No cutting within 300 feet of streams, lakes, ponds, or wet/dry areas. Do not fall or drag trees across streams.
- NOTE: The Salmon Wild and Scenic & National Recreational River corridor as well as the Highway 93 corridor from North Fork to the Montana State Line are closed each side for 1/4 mile.
- Reference the Fuelwood Maps of adjacent National Forests and BLM areas, please check with District Offices for information, rules and regulations applicable to cutting wood in these areas.
