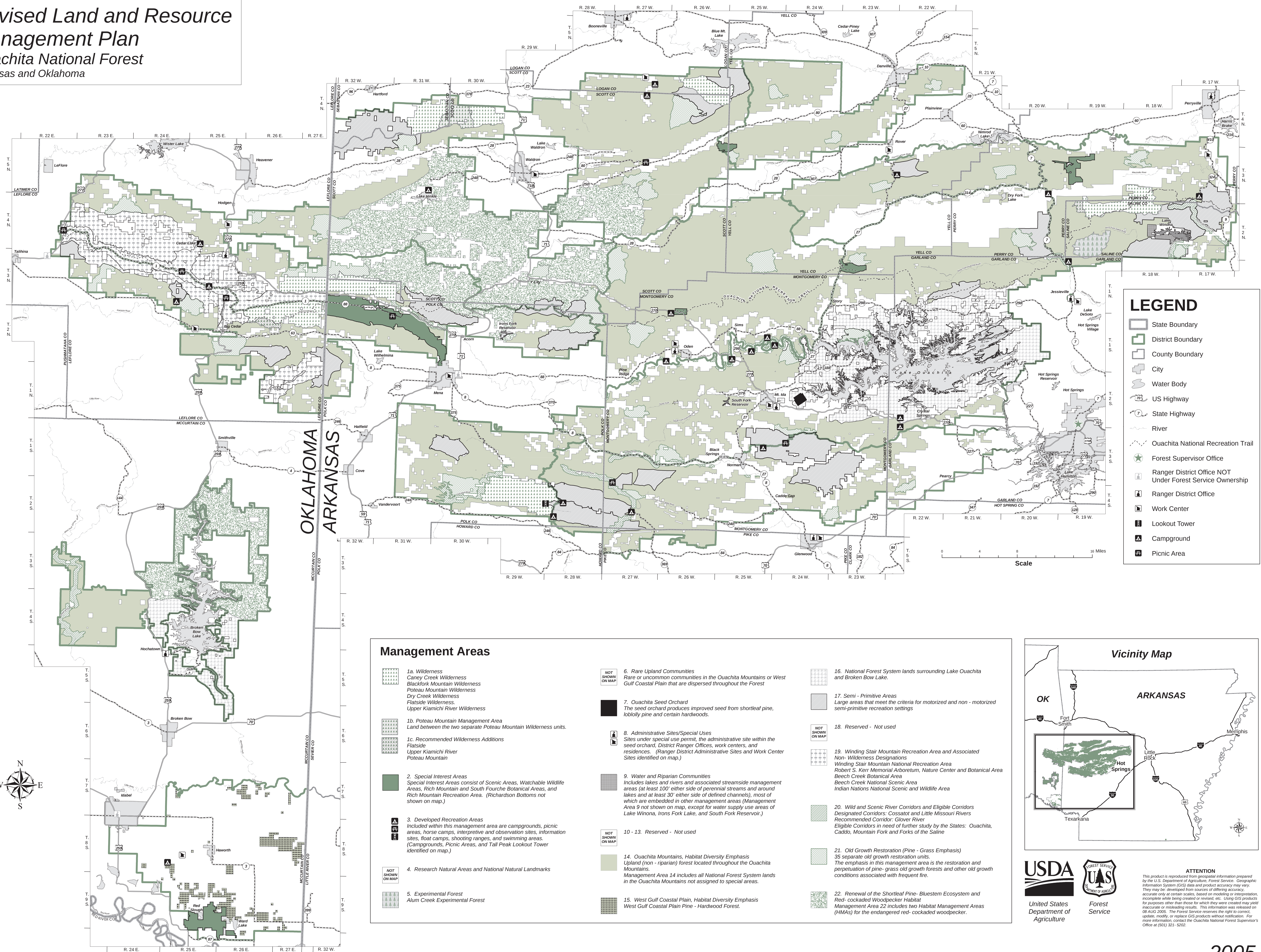

Arkansas and Oklahoma



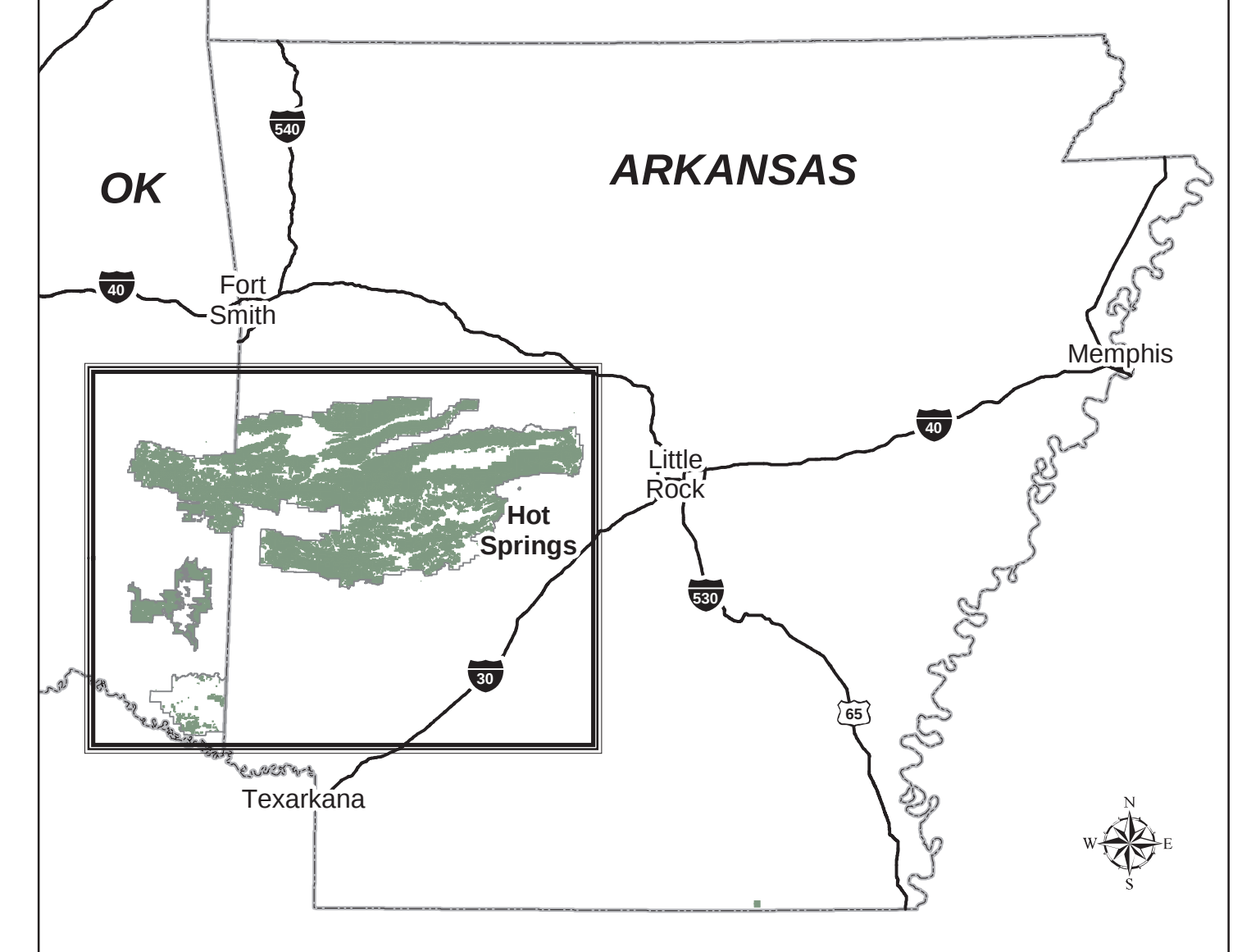

Management Areas

- 1a. Wilderness
Caney Creek Wilderness
Blackfork Mountain Wilderness
Poteau Mountain Wilderness
Dry Creek Wilderness
Flatside Wilderness
Upper Kiamichi River Wilderness
- 1b. Poteau Mountain Management Area
Land between the two separate Poteau Mountain Wilderness units.
- 1c. Recommended Wilderness Additions
Flatside
Upper Kiamichi River
Poteau Mountain
- 2. Special Interest Areas
Special Interest Areas consist of Scenic Areas, Watchable Wildlife Areas, Rich Mountain and South Fourche Botanical Areas, and Rich Mountain Recreation Area. (Richardson Bottoms not shown on map.)
- 3. Developed Recreation Areas
Included within this management area are campgrounds, picnic areas, horse camps, interpretive and observation sites, information sites, float camps, shooting ranges, and swimming areas. (Campgrounds, Picnic Areas, and Tall Peak Lookout Tower identified on map.)
- 4. Research Natural Areas and National Natural Landmarks
- 5. Experimental Forest
Alum Creek Experimental Forest
- 6. Rare Upland Communities
Rare or uncommon communities in the Ouachita Mountains or West Gulf Coastal Plain that are dispersed throughout the Forest
- 7. Ouachita Seed Orchard
The seed orchard produces improved seed from shortleaf pine, loblolly pine and certain hardwoods.
- 8. Administrative Sites/Special Uses
Sites under special use permit, the administrative site within the seed orchard, District Ranger Offices, work centers, and residences. (Ranger District Administrative Sites and Work Center Sites identified on map.)
- 9. Water and Riparian Communities
Includes lakes and rivers and associated streamside management areas (at least 100' either side of perennial streams and around lakes and at least 30' either side of defined channels), most of which are embedded in other management areas (Management Area 9 not shown on map, except for water supply use areas of Lake Winona, Irons Fork Lake, and South Fork Reservoir.)
- 10 - 13. Reserved - Not used
- 14. Ouachita Mountains, Habitat Diversity Emphasis
Upland (non - riparian) forest located throughout the Ouachita Mountains. Management Area 14 includes all National Forest System lands in the Ouachita Mountains not assigned to special areas.
- 15. West Gulf Coastal Plain, Habitat Diversity Emphasis
West Gulf Coastal Plain Pine - Hardwood Forest.
- 16. National Forest System lands surrounding Lake Ouachita and Broken Bow Lake.
- 17. Semi - Primitive Areas
Large areas that meet the criteria for motorized and non - motorized semi-primitive recreation settings
- 18. Reserved - Not used
- 19. Winding Stair Mountain Recreation Area and Associated Non - Wilderness Designations
Winding Stair Mountain National Recreation Area
Robert S. Kerr Memorial Arboretum, Nature Center and Botanical Area
Beech Creek National Scenic Area
Indian Nations National Scenic and Wildlife Area
- 20. Wild and Scenic River Corridors and Eligible Corridors
Designated Corridors: Cossatot and Little Missouri Rivers
Recommended Corridor: Glover River
Eligible Corridors in need of further study by the States: Ouachita, Caddo, Mountain Fork and Forks of the Saline
- 21. Old Growth Restoration (Pine - Grass Emphasis)
35 separate old growth restoration units.
The emphasis in this management area is the restoration and perpetuation of pine-grass old growth forests and other old growth conditions associated with frequent fire.
- 22. Renewal of the Shortleaf Pine- Bluestem Ecosystem and Red-cockaded Woodpecker Habitat
Management Area 22 includes two Habitat Management Areas (HMAs) for the endangered red-cockaded woodpecker.
