



## Wildfire Fact Sheet

### FIRE SUMMARY JULY 14, 2025

The Central Idaho Dispatch Zone is at **HIGH** Fire Danger

There have been five (5) new fires reported on the Salmon-Challis National Forest in the last week. To date, there have been 12 wildfires reported on the Forest with 12 of the fires being declared out.

Endoah (July 11): located approximately four (4) miles northwest of Indian Creek Guard Station. The 0.10 acre fire burning in timber and grass is out.

Papoose (July 10): located approximately 44 miles of Salmon. The 0.10 acre fire burning in a snag is out.

Anderson (July 9): located approximately three (3) miles north of Gibbonsville. The 0.10 acre fire burning in a single tree is out.

McConn (July 9): located approximately 13 miles northwest of North Fork. The 0.10 acre fire burning in a log within the 2012 Mustang Fire scar is out.

Blacktail (July 8): located approximately 18 miles north of Salmon. The 5 acre fire burning in dead and down fir and grass is out.

**Weather:** A shortwave trough today and cold front later on Tuesday will lead to near critical to critical fire weather conditions due to a mix of gusty winds, low relative humidity, and isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms. Stronger storms today and Tuesday will be capable of producing wind gusts up to 50 mph, with best coverage of thunderstorms expected Tuesday afternoon/evening. A cooler and drier airmass will shift into place on Wednesday, ahead of a warming and drier trend back starting Thursday into the weekend.

Ensure your campfire is dead out. If it is too hot to touch, it is too hot to leave! One Less Spark Means One Less Wildfire.

Nationally, there are 36 uncontained large fires being managed under a full suppression strategy and 78 fires managed under a strategy other than full suppression.
