



Wildfire Fact Sheet

FIRE SUMMARY JULY 21, 2025

The Central Idaho Dispatch Zone is at **HIGH** Fire Danger

There have been two (2) new fires reported on the Salmon-Challis National Forest in the last week. To date, there have been 14 wildfires reported on the Forest with 14 of the fires being declared out.

Double Springs (July 17): located approximately 28 miles southeast of Challis. The 0.25 acre fire burning in timber and brush is out.

Broad (July 14): located approximately 20 miles southwest of Mackay. The 0.10 acre fire burning in a duff is out.

Weather: Humidity will begin trending higher today as moisture increases courtesy of the incoming trough. Wind gusts will range from 30 to 40 mph. Isolated storms will increase fire danger as storms will be capable of producing 40 to 50 mph outflows with isolated gusts potentially exceeding 50 mph. Winds will be lighter on Tuesday and relative humidity will increase but the trend will get drier again beginning Wednesday.

Ensure your campfire is dead out. If it is too hot to touch, it is too hot to leave! One Less Spark Means One Less Wildfire.

Nationally, there are 39 uncontained large fires being managed under a full suppression strategy and 44 fires managed under a strategy other than full suppression.
