**FOREST ORDER #08-11-08-25-08**

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50 (a) and (b) for the protection of public health and safety following Tropical Storm Helene, the following acts are prohibited in the Poplar Boat Launch Area on the Appalachian Ranger District of the Pisgah National Forest. This closure is effective until 04/30/2026 or until rescinded by an authorized Forest Service official, whichever occurs first.

1. Going into or being in the described closure area. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e)
2. Entering or using developed recreation sites listed below - 36 CFR § 261.58(b)
3. Use by any type of traffic (motorized, pedestrian, bicycle, etc.) and/or being on a National Forest System Road listed below - 36 CFR § 261.54(b)(e)

Under 261.58(b), the following closed developed recreation sites have been identified:

Poplar Boat Launch

Under 261.5(e), the following closure areas have been identified (descriptions below):

The described closure areas are within Mitchell County and include all NFS lands within the following boundaries:

The closed area is described as all contiguous Forest Service land within the Poplar Boat Launch area, east of the Nolichucky River and northwest of NC-197. Also included is a portion of Forest Service land west of the Nolichucky River, confined by the Nolichucky River on the east, north and west, and the northernmost portion of Flattop Mountain on the south. This closure area includes the following roads and trails:

NFR 5580 Poplar Boat Ramp

Pursuant to 36 CFR, § 261.50 (e), the following persons or areas are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a special use permit or contract specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act of omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Owners or lessees of land in the area are exempt from road closures that access property.
4. Residents in the area are exempt from road closures that access residence.
