Introduction

The 2012 Planning Rule, issued by the Forest Service in April 2012, allows the USDA Forest Service to make non-substantive corrections or adjustments to the revised Forest Plan using a process called “Administrative Changes.” “Administrative changes” as defined by 36 CFR 219.13(c) in the 2012 Planning Rule “*is any change to a plan that is not a plan amendment or plan revision. Administrative changes include corrections of clerical errors to any part of the plan, conformance of the plan to new statutory or regulatory requirements, or changes to other content in the plan (§219. 7(f)).*”

Background

On July 27, 2022, James Duran, Acting Forest Supervisor of the Santa Fe National Forest, rendered a final decision on the 2022 Santa Fe National Forest Land Management Plan (Forest Plan).

Two clerical errors and an invalid web address have been identified which need corrected.

Objectives for Caja Del Rio Wildlife and Cultural Interpretive Management Area (MA-CAJA-O-2) and (MA-CAJA-O-3) updated to (MA-CAJA-O-1a) and (MA-CAJA-O-1b), respectively.

Conclusion

This Administrative Change is in accordance with 36 CFR 219.13(c). This action does not constitute conformance of the plan to new statutory or regulatory requirements or a change to plan components as defined by 36 CFR 219.7(e) and meets the intent of “*corrections of clerical errors to any part of the plan*” (36 CFR 219.13(c)). This Administrative Change is considered non-substantive because it corrects the errors and brings into the Forest Plan a management approach used to inform future proposed actions.

This Administrative Change #2 is effective upon signature and being posted online in accordance with 36 CFR 219.16(c)(6). Administrative changes are not subject to the pre-decisional administrative review (objection) process (36 CFR 219.50).
