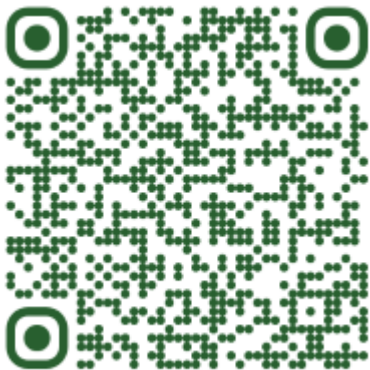


PERMIT INFORMATION

- ⇒ A permit is required to remove any forest product. Permits are available at each Forest District Office or online.
- ⇒ All cutting equipment must comply with fire regulations. (Spark Arrestors)
- ⇒ Permits are NOT transferable.
- ⇒ Cut ONLY unmarked standing dead OR down trees. (For an evergreen to be considered dead, all needles, must be red, brown or absent.)
- ⇒ Do NOT cut or remove trees that have bird cavities, nests, or other signs of wildlife habitation.
- ⇒ Do NOT gather firewood within 100 feet of any road, 150 feet of live streams, 200 feet of campgrounds, trailheads, recreation sites, or State and Federal Highways.
- ⇒ Do NOT collect firewood from active timber sale areas.
- ⇒ Do not cut trees marked with paint or signs.
- ⇒ Stumps should be as close to the ground as possible or no more than 12 inches high.
- ⇒ Measure the wood at the largest end with the maximum length being less than 8 feet on pieces that are 9 inches or larger in diameter.

KNOW WHERE YOU ARE!

Remember that not all land within the exterior boundary of the National Forest is publicly owned. The Forest Service cannot authorize you to cut or gather wood on private land. It is YOUR responsibility to be certain you are not trespassing on private land.

Maps which show accurate Federal and State ownership may be purchased at the nearest Ranger District Office.

We cannot provide more specific information about private ownership. If you wish to gather on private land you must contact the land owner for permission.

You may contact Wyoming State Land Office at 307-777-7331 for information about gathering wood on State land.

- ⇒ Permits are valid through 12/31 of the year purchased
- ⇒ \$5.00 per cord
- ⇒ Minimum 4 cords per purchase.
- ⇒ Maximum 10 cords per year per permittee
- ⇒ Permits are now available to purchase online at www.fs.usda.gov/r02/mbrtb (Firewood Permits/Buy Firewood Permits)

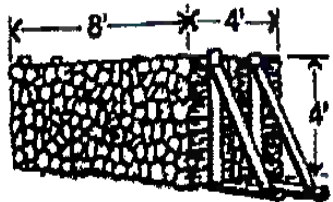
HOW MUCH WOOD IS A CORD?

1 Cord is approximately 2662 pounds OR
4' x 4' x 8' = 128 cubic feet

1/2 cord is approximately 1331 pounds

Firewood is commonly measured in Cords. A standard cord is the amount of tightly piled wood in a stack 4 feet wide by 4 feet high by 8 feet long.

Measuring and Transporting



A standard cord can be described as a well-stacked pile. 4 by 4 by 8 feet.

The load accountability portion on the front of the permit must be filled out in ink. Failure to do so will result in a citation.



The average half-ton pickup truck can carry a half cord of dry wood without overloading the vehicle.

A truckload of firewood can mean just about anything and converting to cords can be a bit of a trick. The key is to measure the truck bed in question and multiply its inside height by width and length to determine its volume. If the truck can carry 64 cubic feet of goods, then it can accommodate roughly a half cord of wood depending on how it is stacked. If the wood is piled randomly in the truck's bed, then you won't know how many cords it carries until you stack the pieces in the woodshed.

Areas Closed to Fuel Wood Cutting

Forest-wide

- ◆ Within 100 feet of developed areas, including campgrounds, picnic areas, recreation sites and other buildings
- ◆ Within 500 feet of the Snowy Range, WY Hwy 130, and Battle Highway, WY Hwy 70
- ◆ Areas that have No Woodcutting signs
- ◆ Areas with active timber sales or logging operations
- ◆ Wilderness Areas, Research Natural Areas and Special Interest Areas
- ◆ Within 150 feet of live streams or lake shorelines

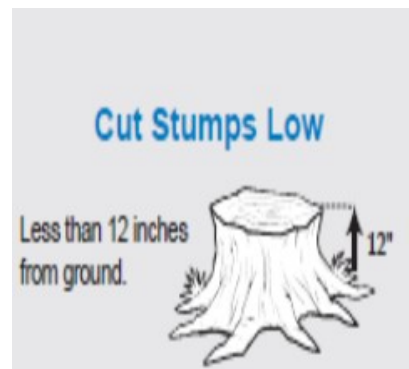
- ◆ The entire Pole Mountain Area, including Vedauwoo

- ◆ The Fish Creek Fall Recreation Area

- ◆ Within 300 feet of Bear Creek Road, Forest Road 900
