The US Forest Service Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest has 9-10 positions available for summer internships during 2026! These opportunities will provide field work experience, exposure to Forest service policies and mission, and exposure to the diversity of jobs available in the Forest Service.

- **Who:** Any current UNR student (cannot have graduated yet).
- **What:** Full-time (40 hours/week) internships during the summer with some opportunities available to continue working part-time during the school year.
- **Where:** Opportunities available in Carson City, Elko, or Sparks in Nevada (Sparks positions typically involve forest-wide travel with camping).
- **When:** Internships typically run from mid- to late-May through mid-August.

How to apply?

- Please submit your application package to alison.paulson@usda.gov by 5 p.m. on Friday March 6. Please include a resume (no more than two pages), optional cover letter (no more than one page), unofficial transcript, and names/contact information of three references.
- Resumes and/or cover letters should include information about why you are interested in these positions, describe past relevant work experience, and describe any experience working outdoors, camping, hiking, or backpacking. If you have any safety training, that would also be good to highlight.
