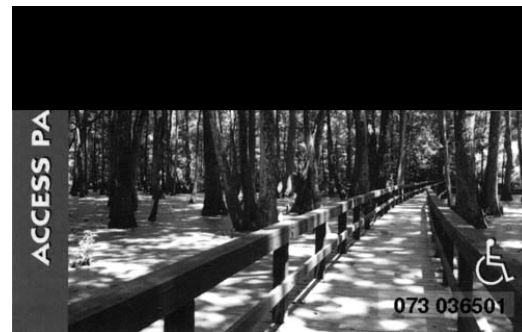


Federal Interagency Senior & Access Pass Information

These passes are issued to US citizens or permanent residents only. Senior passes are for persons over 62 years old. Access passes are for persons that have a permanent disability.



What are the benefits?

- Valid for the passholder's lifetime.
- Provides free entrance to Fish and Wildlife Service Refuges, and National Park areas that charge an entrance fee.
- Provides free use of sites operated by Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, and Forest Service that charge a standard amenity fee, such as trails and picnic area.
- The pass **may** provide a discount on some expanded amenity fees such as camping, boat launches and swimming sites, and guided tours. Look for signs that indicate that a fee is required.
- For Per Vehicle Fee Areas: Admits the pass holder and any accompanying passengers in a private non-commercial vehicle.
- For Per Person Fee Areas: Admits pass holder and up to 3 persons (not exceeding 4 persons total).
- Accepted at U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Tennessee Valley Authority areas.

How is the pass used?

- This pass belongs to you, the signer, **ONLY** and you must be present for the pass to be used. Photo identification may be requested to verify pass ownership.
- At unstaffed sites, the pass must be displayed in the window of your vehicle using the provided hangtag hung from your rear view mirror.
- Under no circumstances can this pass be transferred to another person.



A few notes about your Federal Interagency Access Pass...

Passes are:

- Non-transferable
- Non-replaceable if lost or stolen. You need to obtain/purchase a new one if this should happen.
- Replaceable if damaged as long as identification is provided to validate ownership and a portion of the pass is identifiable.

Passes must be:

- Signed by the pass holder to be valid.
- Punched with an expiration date when purchased/issued.

Passes **DO NOT** provide a discount at interpretive association bookstores.
