

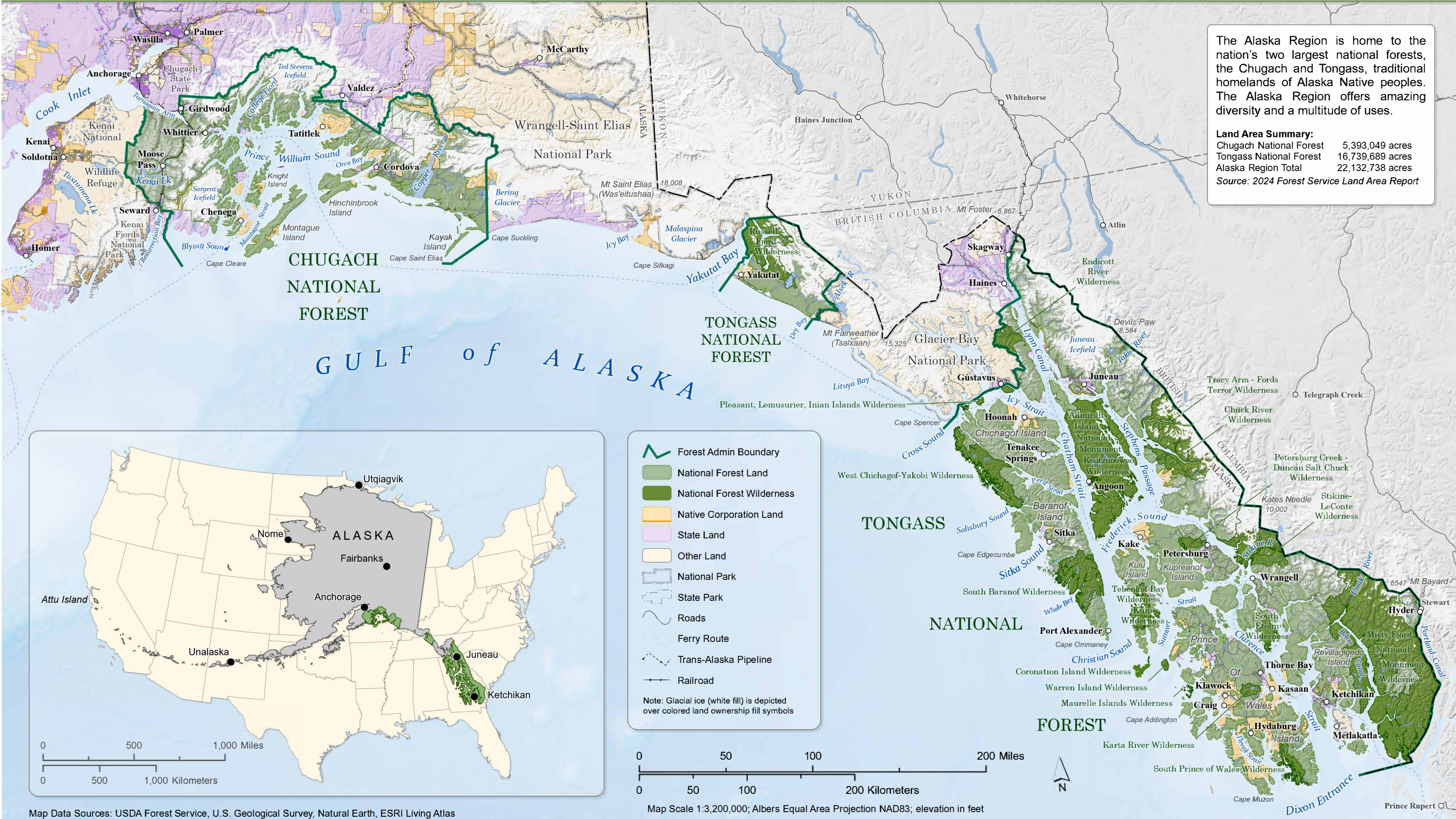
# ALASKA'S NATIONAL FORESTS
