



PURPOSE AND CONTENTS OF THIS MAP

The designations shown on this Over Snow Vehicle Use Map (OSVUM) were made by the responsible offical pursuant to 36 CFR 212.81: are effective as of the date on the front cover of this OSVUM and will remain in effect until superceded by next year's OSVUM.

It is the responsibility of the user to acquire the current OSVUM. This OSVUM shows the National Forest System roads and the areas on National Forest that are designated for over snow vehicle use pursuant to 36 CFR 212.51. This OSVUM also identifies any seasonal restrictions that apply on those routes and in those areas.

Designation of a road or area for over snow vehicle use by a particular class of vehicle under 36 CFR 212.51 should not be interpreted as ncouraging or inviting use or implying that the road travel. Vehicle designations include parking along designated routes when it is safe to do so and when not causing damage to National Forest System resources. National Forest System Roads are weather conditions and natural events may render designated roads and trails impassable for extended periods. Designated areas may contain

clearance vehicles or four-wheel-drive vehicles. 
