It is a good idea to pack a chainsaw in case you encounter downed trees in the road.

222	Dixie (Highway 14 to Dixie)	Open	07/18/2022	Pavement to within 4 miles of Dixie, then gravel on steep, narrow hill. Maintained yearlong by Idaho County.
222	Mackey Bar (Dixie to Mackey Bar)	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel road; rough in places. Switchbacks and narrow road with turn outs.
233	Crooked River (Highway 14 to Orogrande Town Site)	Open	07/18/2022	Well-maintained gravel road. Narrow and windy in some parts along Crooked River with limited turnouts.
233	Orogrande Town Site to Orogrande Summit	Open	07/18/2022	Rough and rutted; very steep in some areas.
233	Orogrande Summit to Del Rio Mine/Jumbo Camp	Closed	07/18/2022	Rough and rutted; very steep in some areas.
233I	Orogrande Summit to Wildhorse Campground	Open	07/18/2022	Rough and rutted; very steep in some areas.
234	Red River Hot Springs	Open	07/18/2022	Maintained by county; good gravel road.
244	Lightning Creek	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
279	Cove	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.

283	Table Meadows	Open	07/18/2022	Table Meadows Road into Elk City. Gravel and native surface road.
284	Elk City Wagon Road	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
307	Elk City Wagon Road Extension	Open	07/18/2022	Connects with Newsome. Gravel and native surfaces.
309	Hungry Ridge	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
311	Orogrande to Penman Hill/Dixie	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
421	Whitewater	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surface road with steep grades and narrow roadway with limited turnouts.
443	Limber Luke	Open	07/18/2022	From Elk City to Limber Luke Campground and the junction with Road 464 at the district boundary. Good gravel road.
443	Falls Point	Closed	07/18/2022	Over the top to Selway Falls; from the junction with Road 464 at the district boundary to Selway Falls.
464	Boundary	Open	07/18/2022	From the junction with Road 443 at the northern district boundary, along the northern boundary to the junction with Road 284. Good gravel road.
469	Peasley Creek	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surface road with steep drop offs.
484	Fischer-Placer	?	07/18/2022	Native surface road.
492	Santiam	?	07/18/2022	Native surface road.
648	Lower Cougar	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
649	Silver Leggett Creek	Open	07/18/2022	Lots of brush hanging in roadway. Gravel and native surfaces.

650	Lower Clear Creek	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
651	O'Hara	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces - average forest road.
1103	Cayuse Connection	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
1105	Cougar Creek	?	07/18/2022	Gravel road.
1106	Sears Creek/ Green Creek	?	07/18/2022	Gravel road.
1150	Moose Butte	Open	07/18/2022	Accessible to locked gate. Native surface road; some small slumps, but nothing major.

1183	Blanco	Open	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
1190	Trapper Creek Grade	Open	07/18/2022	Road 222 to Red Mailbox. Gravel; steep and one lane in many places.
1190	Dixie Summit to Red Mailbox	Open	07/18/2022	Good gravel road; narrow in places.
1199	Elk City to Newsome	Open	07/18/2022	Good gravel road; one lane and steep in places.
1803	Wheeler Mountain	Open	07/18/2022	Good gravel road.
1808	Elk City Wagon Road	Open	07/18/2022	Elk City to Newsome. Good gravel and native surfaces. Narrow in places.
1858	Newsome	Open	07/18/2022	Highway 14 to Lytle Cow Camp at Road 464. Good gravel road. Snow floor with slick conditions.
2009	Grouse Creek Connection	?	07/18/2022	Gravel and native surfaces.
9816	Deadwood	Open	07/18/2022	Generally, good gravel and native surface road.

Forest Road Check List

- ✓ Watch for & obey posted speed limits. Forest Service roads can be narrow, rocky, & not meant for high speeds.
- ✓ Be careful braking on gravel roads. Allow more time and distance when coming to a stop.
- ✓ Beware of rocks, boulders, road washouts, downed trees and brush on the roadway.
- ✓ Use appropriate tires for the terrain and conditions you'll be traveling.
- ✓ Remember to stay on authorized roads.
- ✓ Plan appropriately for food, gas, and lodging, which may not be readily available along Forest Service roads.
- ✓ Always carry extra food and water.
- ✓ Always let someone know your plans and stick to those plans.
