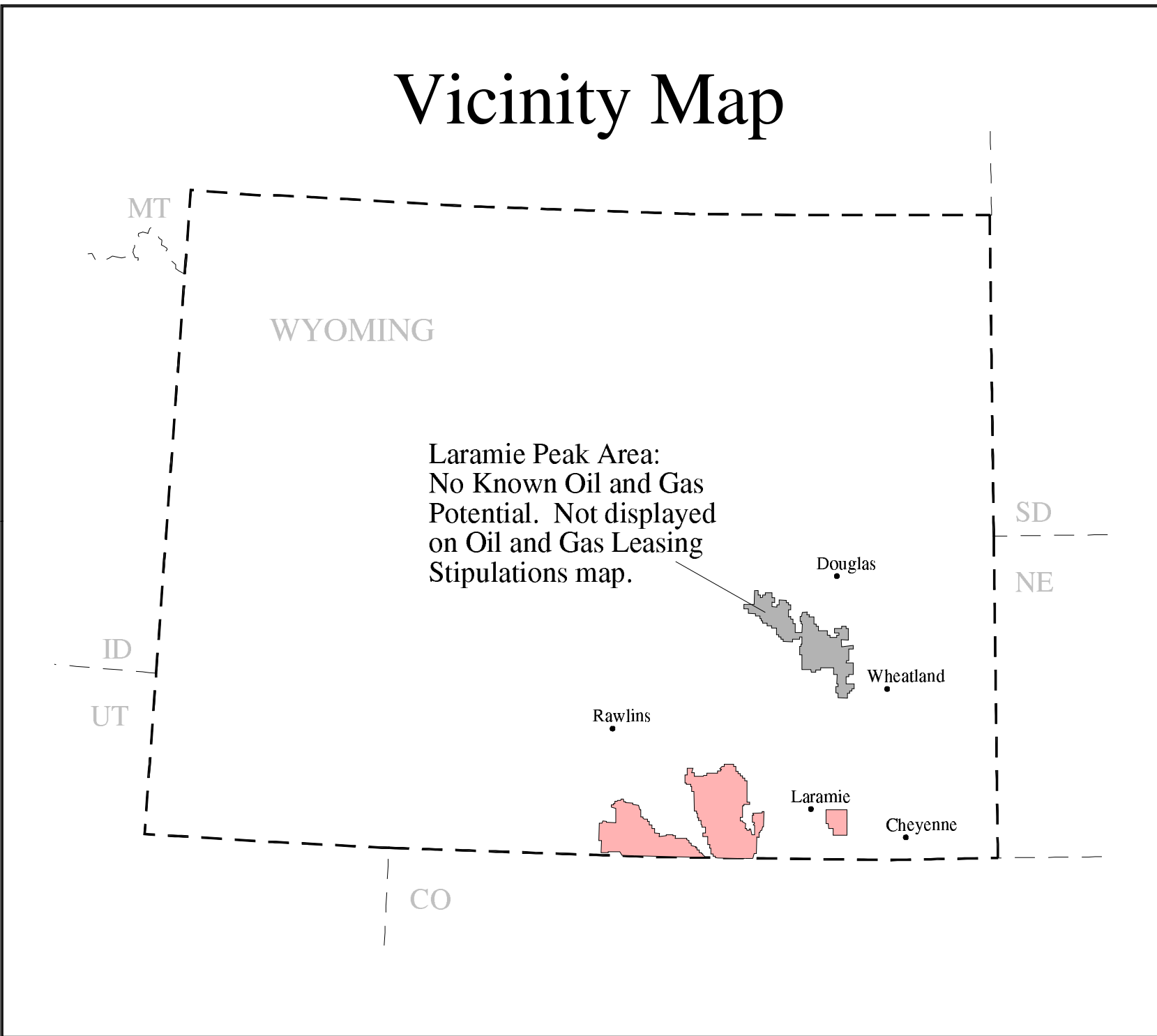

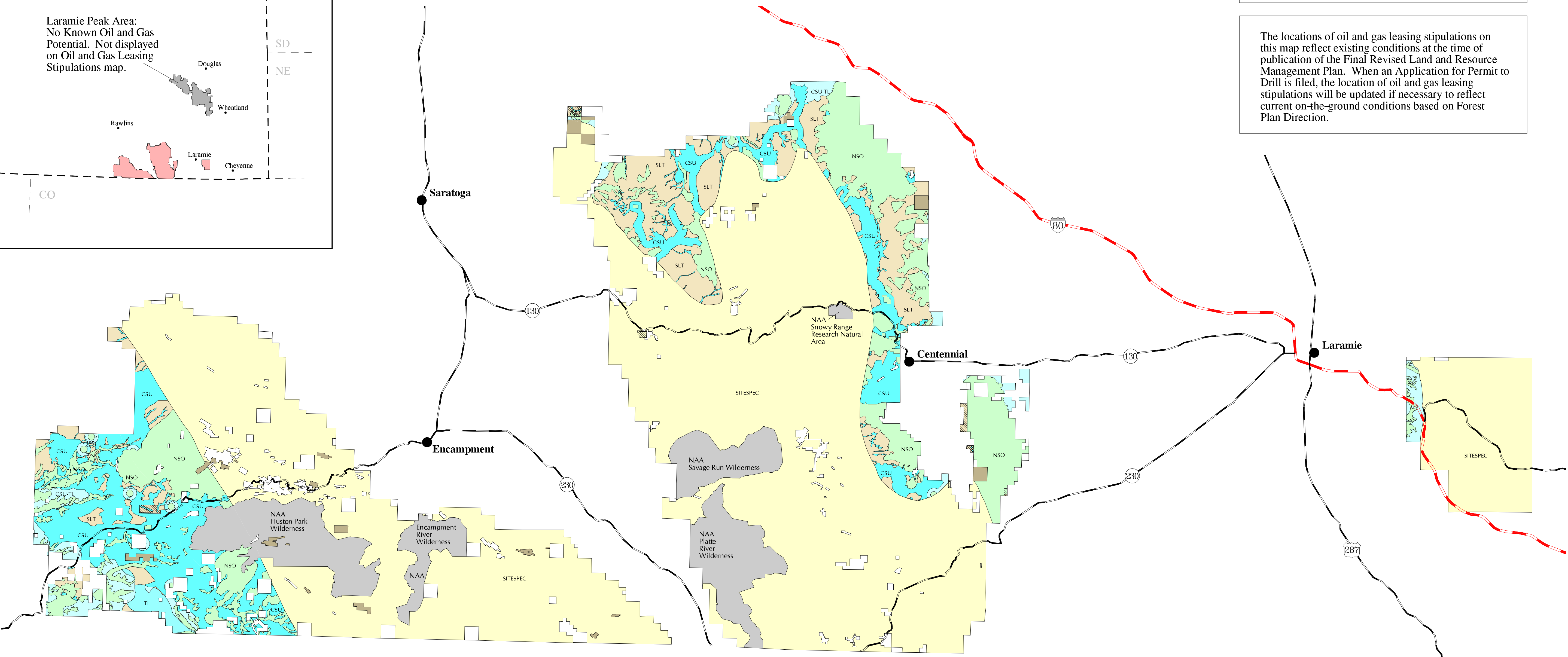
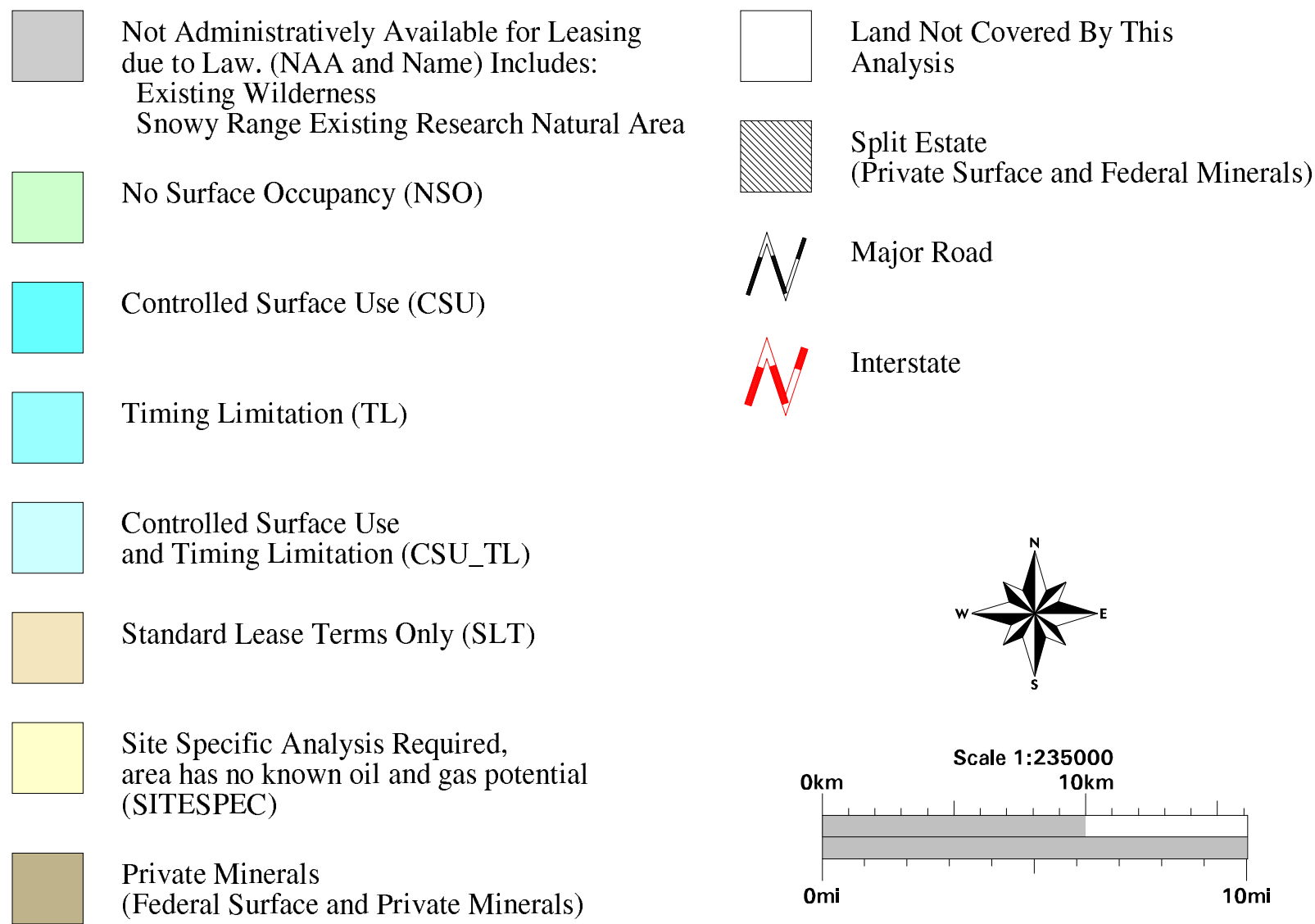


Oil and Gas Leasing Stipulations

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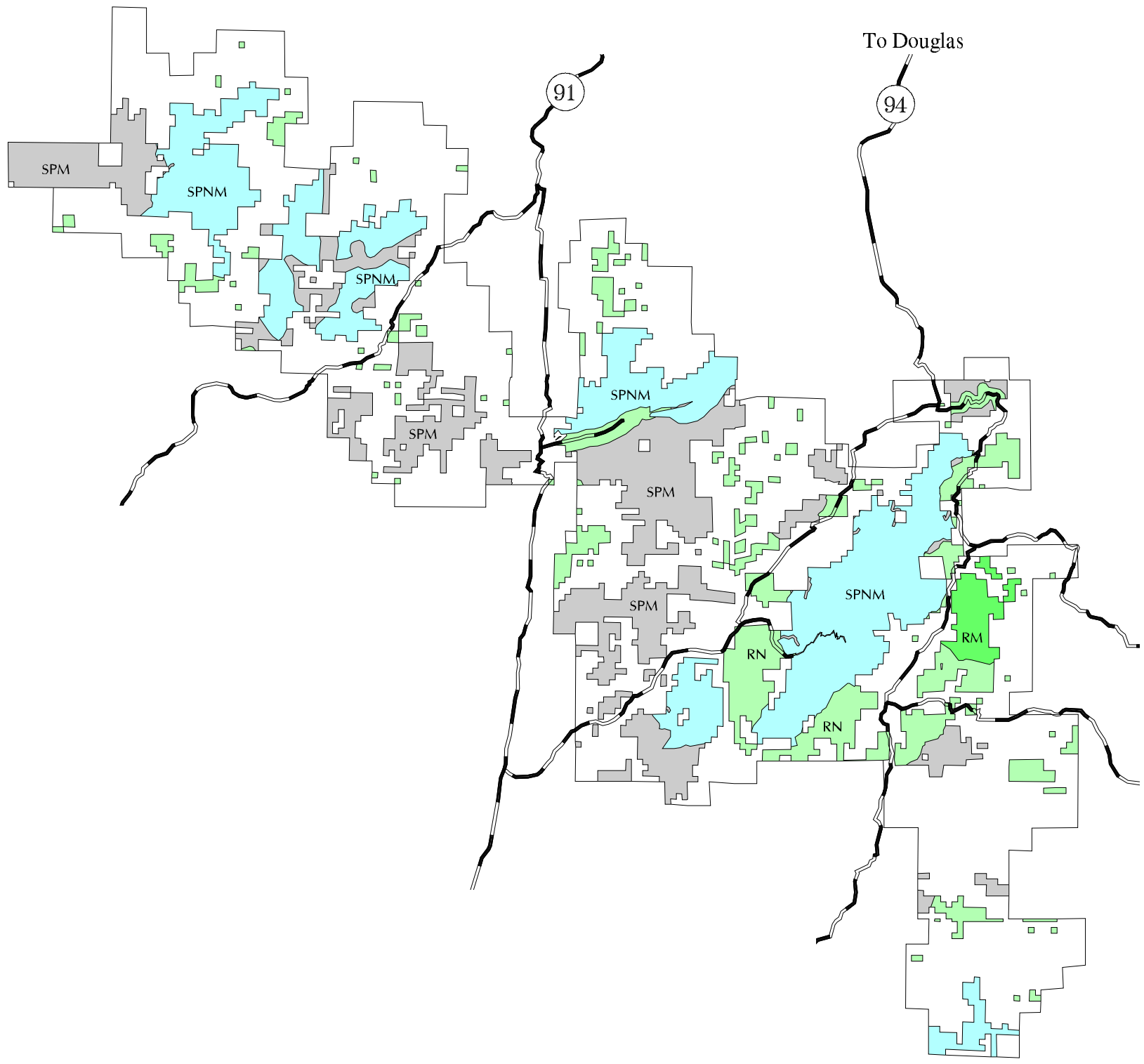
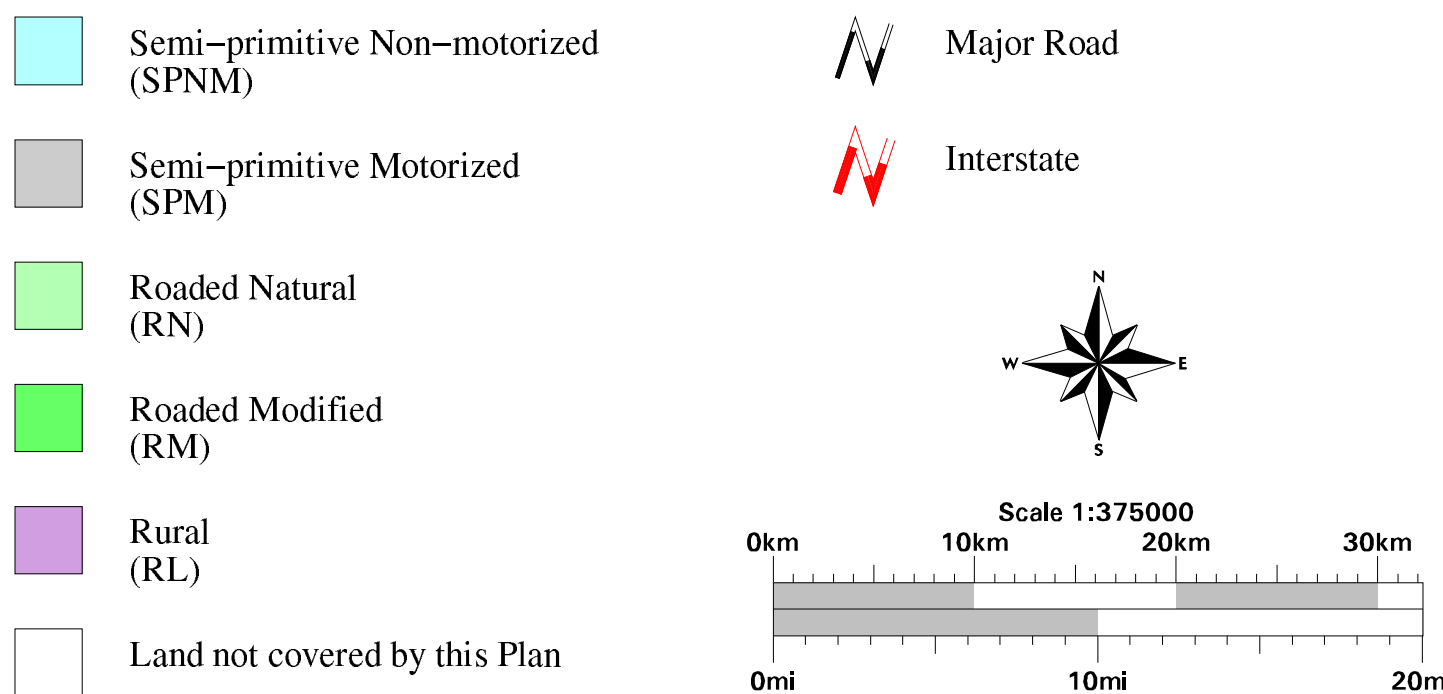
The locations of oil and gas leasing stipulations on this map reflect existing conditions at the time of publication of the Final Revised Land and Resource Management Plan. When an Application for Permit to Drill is filed, the location of oil and gas leasing stipulations will be updated if necessary to reflect current on-the-ground conditions based on Forest Plan Direction.

Oil and Gas Leasing Stipulations Legend



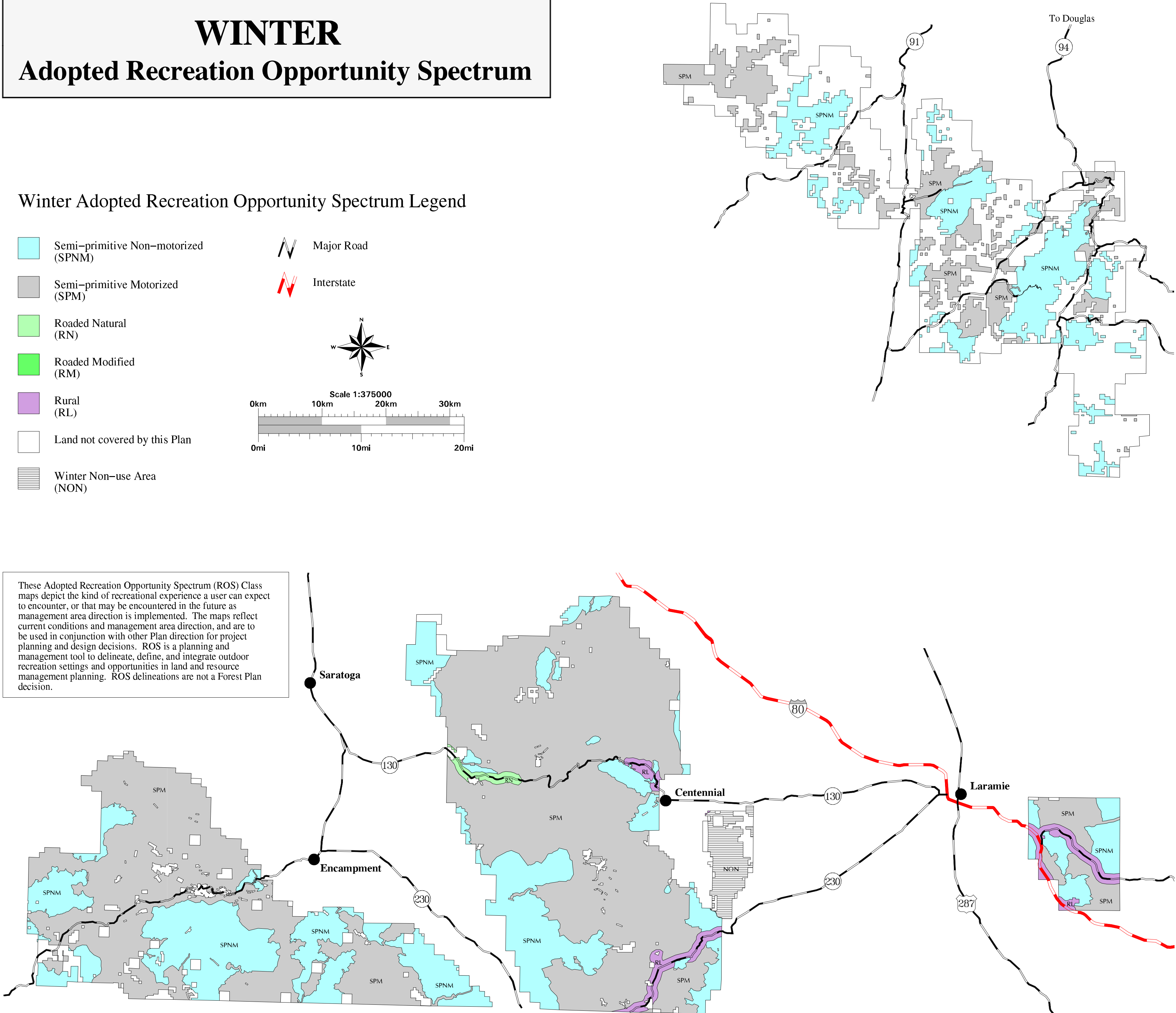
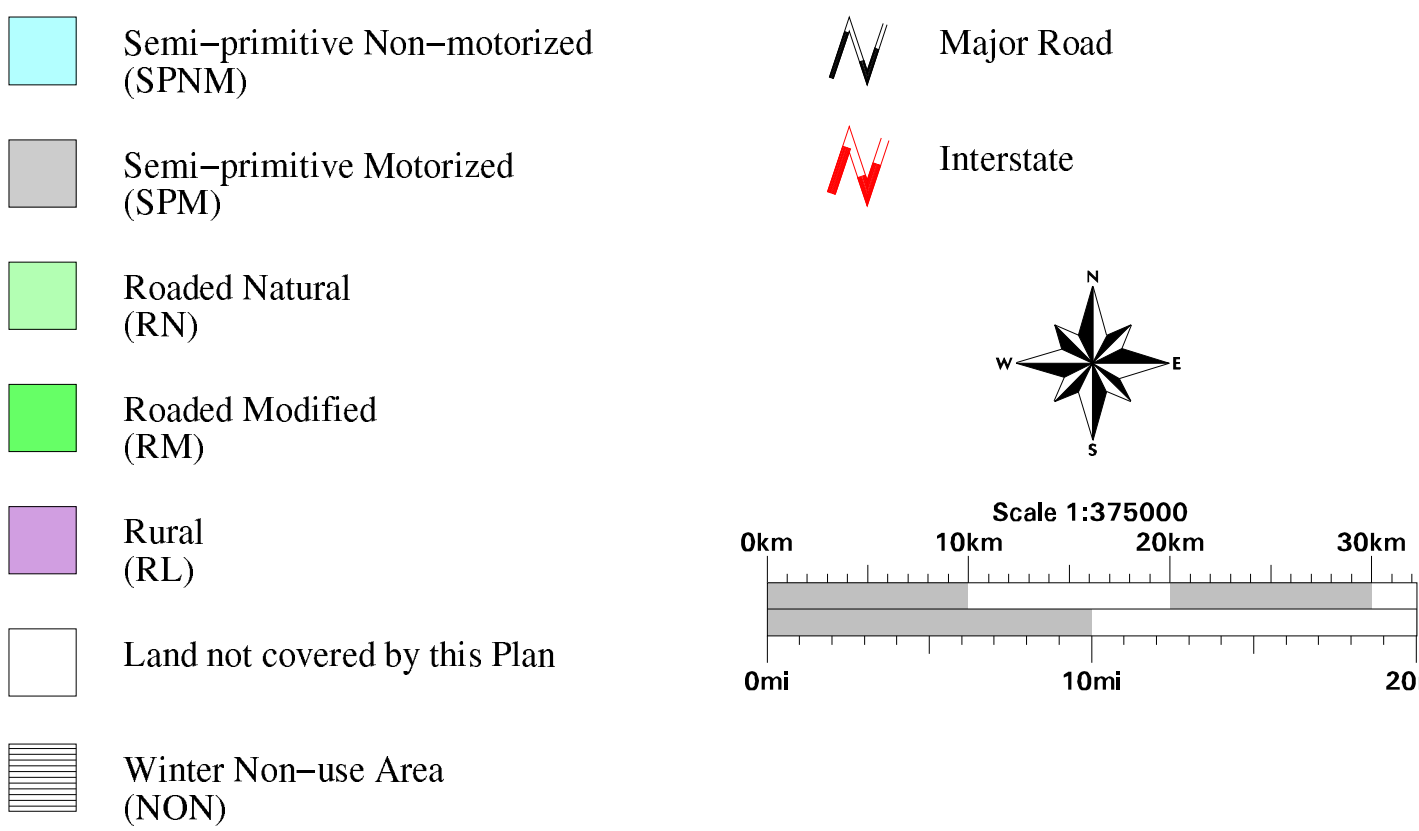

These Adopted Recreation Opportunity Spectrum (ROS) Class maps depict the kind of recreational experience a user can expect to encounter, or that may be encountered in the future as management area direction is implemented. The maps reflect current conditions and management area direction, and are to be used in conjunction with other Plan direction for project planning and design decisions. ROS is a planning and management tool to delineate, define, and integrate outdoor recreation settings and opportunities in land and resource management planning. ROS delineations are not a Forest Plan decision.

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
