Site reservations may be made up to six months in advance.

General Campground Information

Check out: 11am Check in: 2pm

Generator hours: 6am to 10pm

Site capacity: up to 8 people, 2-3 tents and tents must fit within established camping pad, vehicles and trailers must fit on spur length.

Dogs must be on a leash in the campground.

There is a 14 day stay limit on the Rio Grande National Forest.

Conejos Peak Ranger District campgrounds are generally open from May to September. * Check the Rio Grande website or call the Conejos Peak Ranger District Office for up to date information.

** Campgrounds open outside of the summer season will have limited amenities and may be hard to access due to road conditions.*



Leave No Trace

Plan Ahead and Prepare	Know the rules, read the signs
Camp on Durable Surfaces	Only park and camp in allowed areas
Dispose of Waste Properly	Pack out all trash, don't burn it
Leave What You Find	Take pictures so other can enjoy too
Minimize Camp-fire Impacts	Know fire restrictions; use provided fire rings
Respect Wildlife	Don't feed wildlife, properly store all bear attractants
Respect Other Visitors	Minimize noise; be nice, say hi

Campgrounds

Alamosa

From La Jara, take US 285 north to County Rd 15. Take Rd 15 West 10.6 miles to FS Rd. 255. Turn left onto FS Rd 255 and go 11.4 miles to FS Rd 250. Continue straight on Rd 250 and go 3.3 miles to the campground sign. Turn left into the campground.



Aspen Glade

From Antonito, take US 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue straight on Hwy 17 and go 15.4 miles to the campground sign. Turn left at the sign and go 0.2 miles to the campground.



Conejos

From Antonito, take US 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue on Hwy 17 for 21.9 miles. Turn right on FS Rd 250 and continue for 6.5 miles. The campground is on the left.



Elk Creek

From Antonito, take US 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue straight on Hwy 17 for 22.6 miles to the campground sign. Turn right onto FS Rd 128. Go 0.1 miles to the T intersection and turn left. Then go 0.4 miles to the Y intersection and bear right into the campground.



Lake Fork

From Antonito, take Hwy 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue on Hwy 17 for 21.9 miles to FS Rd 250. Take FS Rd 250 for 17.3 miles. The campground is on the right.



Mix Lake

From Antonito, take Hwy 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue on Hwy 17 for 21.7 miles to FS Rd 250. Turn right on FS Rd 250 and continue for 23.3 miles. Turn left at FS Rd 250B, continue for .5 miles. The campground is on the left.



Campgrounds cont.

Mogote

From Antonito, take US 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue on Hwy 17 for 13.2 miles to the campground sign. Turn left at the sign and go 0.3 miles. The campground is on the right.

* Pinion and Juniper group sites at Mogote campground are by reservation only.



Spectacle Lake

From Antonito, take US 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue on Hwy 17 for 21.9 miles to the Platoro sign on the right. Turn right onto FS Rd 250 and continue for 6.3 miles. The campground is on the left.



Stunner

From La Jara, take US 285 north to County Rd 15. Take County Rd 15 west 10.6 miles to FS Rd 255. Go 11.4 miles then turn left onto FS Rd 250 and continue for 18.4 miles to the Y intersection. Turn onto FS Rd 380 for 0.4 miles to the campground sign and turn left. Go 0.3 miles to the campground.



Trujillo Meadows

From Antonito, take US 285 south 0.3 miles to Hwy 17. Continue on Hwy 17 for 35.2 miles to the Trujillo Meadows Reservoir sign. Turn right at the sign and go 0.1 miles to the T intersection. Turn right at FS Rd 118 and go 2.1 miles. The campground is on the right.



Dispersed Camping

- Camp at already established dispersed sites.
- Stay 150' from water sources.
- Stay within 300' of the road.
- **Do not leave campfires unattended.**
- 14 day stay limit within 30 days on the RGNF.
- Follow **Leave No Trace Principles**
