TRIPLE ALCOVES TRAIL #27

General Attractions: This scenic trail is located within the Saddle Mountain Wilderness. An easy walk through a pinyon/juniper woodland brings the hiker abruptly to the rim of Marble Canyon. This breathtaking scene from the edge of the canyon includes broad views of Marble Canyon, the Triple Alcoves and President Harding Rapids of the Colorado River, which are all within the Grand Canyon National Park. By looking to the east, you will also view the vast expanse of the Navajo Nation.

Fee: None

Access: From the Kaibab Plateau Visitor Center go east on US 89A, a paved road, for about 20 miles to Forest Development Road (FDR) 8910 (House Rock Wildlife Area); turn right and go 23.5 miles to where FDR 8910 forks and take the right fork; go another 7 miles to the trailhead. FDR 8910 is suitable for passenger cars.

Water and Facilities: None. Bring everything that you will need.

Round Trip Driving Distance from Kaibab Plateau Visitor Center: 101 miles

Length of Trail One-Way: 1/2 mile

Elevation: 6560 feet

USGS Map: Point Imperial (trail not shown on map)

Recommended Season: Late spring, summer, fall and early winter


Use Restrictions: No motorized or mechanized vehicles or equipment may be operated in Saddle Mountain Wilderness.
