



SHIVERS TRAP TRAIL #10

GENERAL INFORMATION: Shivers Trap Trail #10 begins at over 5800' in ponderosa pine and alligator juniper. It descends several hundred feet along its length as pine forest gives way to pinyon-juniper woodland. At lower elevations, the vegetation transitions to chaparral. Be on the lookout for wildflowers during the spring months, including larkspur, sego lilies, and native thistle. This area is home to deer, elk, coyotes, bear, and a variety of bird and reptile species. Fortunate travelers may spot wildlife along the trail.

TR #10 provides a unique view of Granite Mountain, as well as breathtaking panoramas of the Sheridan Mountains, BT Butte, and other prominent landmarks. While there may be some rocky sections that require careful footing, the route to its terminus at FR 665 is pleasant. The return trip, however, is steep and somewhat strenuous.

CAUTION: This trail is open to hikers, horseback riders, mountain bicyclists, motorcycles and OHVs.

Please be considerate or others—slow down and know when to yield the trail.

ACCESS AND TRAILHEAD LOCATION: From its intersection with Hwy 89, travel west on Outer Loop Road 6 miles to Williamson Valley Road. Turn right and continue 13 miles to Camp Wood Road (also County Road 68), on the left. Take Camp Wood Road 15.4 miles to the Camp Wood site, and proceed an additional 3 miles to the trailhead on the left. Parking is fair.

TRAVEL TIME: 1 hour from Chino Valley

ROAD CONDITIONS: A high clearance vehicle is recommended for Camp Wood Road.


HIKING TIME: 3 hours, one-way LENGTH: 5.7 miles DIFFICULTY: Moderate USE: Light

NOTES: Motorized vehicles must be less than 50" wide. This is a multiple use trail. Please be considerate of other users.

RECOMMENDED SEASONS OF USE: Spring, summer, fall, winter
