Dear Stakeholders:

We have drafted a Decision Notice and Finding of No Significant Impact (DN / FONSI) for the SR-28 Shared Use Path, Parking, Safety and Environmental Improvements Project. I have selected Alternative 2, the Proposed Action (PA), which authorizes activities to improve highway safety, infrastructure, summer recreation access, and scenic quality along the SR-28 corridor between Spooner Junction and Sand Harbor. The PA would improve water and air quality in Lake Tahoe and increase non-motorized access to the SR-28 corridor.

The PA also provides approximately 4.64 miles of shared-use pathway, connecting pedestrian trails in six locations, between 303 and 654 additional parking spaces at four sites, 11 to 16 emergency pull-outs and four to ten vista points along the highway, stormwater capture and infiltration, a new effluent pipeline and fiberoptic cable, and an aquatic invasive species (AIS) inspection station.

**To Review** the DN / FONSI and Environmental Assessment: On the project webpage under Project Documents, click on the “Objection” tab.

**To Object:** On the project webpage and under the righthand column heading "Get Connected", click on "Comment / Object on Project".

Objections must be submitted or posted by 11:59 p.m. on 3/9/20 (PST). Objections will only be accepted from those who submitted project-specific written comments during scoping or other designated comment periods. Issues raised in objections must be based on previously submitted comments, unless based on new information arising after the previous comment periods.

At a minimum, objections MUST include:

- Your name, address, and telephone
- Signature or other verification of authorship (scanned signature in email)
- When multiple names are listed in objection, identification of the lead objector
- The project name and to Jeff Marsolais (Forest Supervisor), Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit
- How the environmental analysis or draft decision specifically violates law, regulation, or policy, and your suggested remedies to resolve your objections; and,
- Description of the connection between your objections and your prior comments.
