

Opportunity to Comment on the Wildcat Restoration and Vegetation Management Project

The Ozark-St. Francis National Forests, Boston Mountain Ranger District, has prepared a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for the **Wildcat Restoration and Vegetation Management Project**, which includes a programmatic plan amendment to the Ozark-St. Francis National Forests Plan. This project is in the northeast corner of the Wedington Unit and covers about 940 acres of public lands in Benton and Washington counties, Arkansas. The project involves thinning stands in order to increase health and resiliency of stressed, overstocked trees in the project area. The plan amendment is needed to correct an error in assigning management areas to lands which were originally classified as pastures and openings, but are actually wooded areas.

The analysis within the EA and the associated programmatic plan amendment will be the subject of a 30-day public comment period. The comment period begins on the day after this legal notice is published in the Russellville Courier, the newspaper of record. The comment period provides those interested in or affected by this proposal an opportunity to make their concerns known prior to a decision by the Responsible Official for this project.

On August 16th, 2019, the Forest will host an open house informational meeting where interested persons can come and talk to Forest Service personnel about the project. This open house meeting will be held from 3:00 to 6:00pm at the Tontitown City Administration Building and City Hall, 235 E. Henri de Tonti Blvd, Springdale, AR 72762. Comment forms will be available for those wishing to comment at that time.

The analysis within the Wildcat Restoration and Vegetation Management EA and the associated programmatic plan amendment will result in two separate decisions, which consequently requires two separate but concurrent public comment periods. Comments on the Wildcat Restoration and Vegetation Management EA will be accepted for 30 days while comments on the Programmatic Plan Amendment will also be accepted for 30 days. These two comment periods will begin the day after this legal notice publishes in the Russellville Courier, the Forest newspaper of record. These comment periods provide those interested in or affected by this proposal an opportunity to make their concerns known prior to a decision by the Responsible Official, Craig McBroome, Acting Ozark-St. Francis National Forests Supervisor.

How to Comment and Timeframe on the EA

The proposed project is an activity implementing a land management plan, authorized under the Healthy Forest Restoration Act (HFRA) and is subject to 36 CFR 218 Subparts A and C. Specific written comments (36 CFR 218.2) on the proposed project will be accepted for 30 days following the publication date of the legal notice in the Russellville Courier. This the only way to calculate the comment period for the proposed action documented in the EA. Those wishing to comment should not rely upon dates or timeframe information provided by any other source. If the comment period ends on a Saturday, Sunday, or Federal holiday, comments will be accepted until the end of the next Federal working day.

Only individuals or entities who submit timely and specific written comments (as defined by 36 CFR 218.2) about this proposed project or activity during this or another public comment period established by the Responsible Official will be eligible to file an objection. Other requirements to be eligible to submit an objection are defined by 36 CFR 218.25 (a)(3) and include name, postal address, title of the project and signature or other verification of identity upon request and the identity of the individual or entity who authored the comments. Individual members of an entity must submit their own individual comments in order to have eligibility to object as an individual. A timely submission will be determined as outlined in 36 CFR 218.25(a)(4). It is the responsibility of the sender to ensure timely receipt of any comments submitted. Names and contact information submitted with comments will become part of the public record and may be released under the Freedom of Information Act.

Comments should be within the scope of the proposed action, have a direct relationship to the proposed action, and must include supporting reasons for the Responsible Official to consider (36 CFR 218.2).

How to Comment and Timeframe on the Programmatic Plan Amendment

The proposed project is an activity that includes a programmatic plan amendment and is subject to 36 CFR 219 Subparts A and B. Substantive formal comments (§219.62) on the programmatic plan amendment will be accepted for 30 days following the publication date of the legal notice in the Russellville Courier. This is the only way to calculate the comment period for the programmatic plan amendment. Those wishing to comment should not rely upon dates or timeframe information provided by any other source. If the comment period ends on a Saturday, Sunday, or Federal holiday, comments will be accepted until the end of the next Federal working day.

Only individuals or entities (as defined by 36 CFR 219.53) who submit substantive formal comments (as defined by 36 CFR 219.62) about this plan amendment will be eligible to file an objection. Other requirements to be eligible to submit an objection are defined by 36 CFR 219.54(c) and include name, postal address, name of the plan amendment, signature or other verification of identity upon request, and the identity of the individual or entity who authored the comments. Individual members of an entity must submit their own individual comments in order to have eligibility to object as an individual. A timely submission will be determined as outlined in 36 CFR 219.16(a)(2). It is the responsibility of the sender to ensure timely receipt of any comments submitted. Names and contact information submitted with comments will become part of the public record and may be released under the Freedom of Information Act.

Substantive formal comments are those that are within the scope of the proposal, are specific to the proposal, have a direct relationship to the proposal, and include supporting reasons for the responsible official to consider (36 CFR 219.62).
