I have signed the Final Decision Notice (DN) and Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for the Canyon Lake Dam Access for Repair Project on the Darby/Sula Ranger District of the Bitterroot National Forest.

I have selected the Proposed Action from the Canyon Lake Dam Access for Repair Environmental Assessment (EA) to authorize approximately thirty-two (32) round trip helicopter flights allowing for the repairs to be done on Canyon Lake Dam. After reviewing the analysis, public comments, and the project record, I have decided that the Proposed Action best addresses the purpose and need for the project and provides an appropriate balance for managing competing values and interests in the long-term.

The Canyon Lake Dam Access for Repair Project was subject to the Pre-decisional Administrative Review process, 36CFR 218 subparts A and B. We received one objection. I signed the Decision Notice June 17, 2020
