30-Day Notice of Comment USDA - FOREST SERVICE Lolo National Forest Missoula Ranger District Missoula County, Montana The Forest Service has prepared the Wildfire Adapted Missoula (WAM) Environmental Assessment (EA), which discloses the environmental effects of a risk-based strategic fuels management project that surrounds the communities of Missoula, Lolo, East Missoula, Bonner, Clinton, and Turah, Montana. The project includes wildfire risk reduction fuel treatments and road work to reduce wildfire hazard and risk to communities and emergency response personnel. Pursuant to 36 CFR 218, only those submit timely and specific written comments during this or another public comment period established by the Responsible Official will be eligible to file an objection. Comments should be within the scope of the proposed, have a direct relationship to the proposed activities, and must include supporting reasons for the Responsible Official to consider. Other eligibility requirements include commenter's name and postal address, title of the project, and commenter's signature or other verification of identity upon request and the identity of the individual or entity who authored the comments.
