




Process & Timeline

Common Strengths

- Forest planning and operations.
- Monitoring and impact assessment.
- Stakeholder consultation.
- Coordination with First Nations.
- Extent of <u>reserve systems</u>.
- Protection of <u>threatened and</u> <u>endangered species</u>.
- Control of invasives and exotics.





Common Weaknesses

- <u>Forest health</u> issues arising from backlogged management activities.
- The backlog of <u>road maintenance</u> and decommissioning.
- Monitoring of <u>non-timber forest</u> <u>products</u>.
- Old-growth protection and management issues.
- Inadequate <u>logger safety and training</u>





Feedback from Forest Service

- Processes explored range of issues affecting National Forests
- Systems tested staff ability to perform their responsibilities
- An opportunity for interest groups to provide input
- A way to communicate with the public on what they do well and what issues they face
- May impose additional burdens

Feedback from Auditors

- Would need to find ways to streamline the process
- Not sure if appropriate in all settings
- Impressive in many aspects of management, but some systemic issues
