Digest: Following is an explanation of the changes throughout the directive by section

102-36.40: This supplement issues with minor modification, the direction previously issued in interim directive (ID) 6409.31-2006-2 to Subpart 104-50.001-10.

This direction follows the coding and format structure of the Federal Management Regulation (formerly referred to as the Federal Property Management Regulations).

Subpart A-General Provisions

- 102-36.40** **What definitions apply to this part?**
- Sensitive Personal Property. The agency Property Management Officer is the only position that can determine what property is considered sensitive property. The agency Property management Officer has determined that for the forest Service the following are sensitive items:
- (1) All weapons (including, but not limited to, those used for law enforcement, cone collection, avalanche control, flame launcher, and bear protection);
 - (2) All radiological equipment having a radioactive source;
 - (3) Precise Positioning Service (PPS) Global Positioning System (GPS) receivers capable of receiving P (Y) code broadcast from the Department of Defense Satellite Constellation; and
 - (4) Federal Excess Personal Property (FEPP). All motorized vehicles (including, but not limited to, snowmobiles, all terrain vehicles, dirt bikes, and motorcycles.
