Curlew Job Corps Civilian Conservation Center is a 33-acre campus located in Curlew, Washington, approximately 130 miles northwest of Spokane and 6 miles south of the Canadian border. The most remote of the rural centers, the campus is surrounded by majestic mountains, forests, and rivers and lakes.

## Student Programs & Organizations
