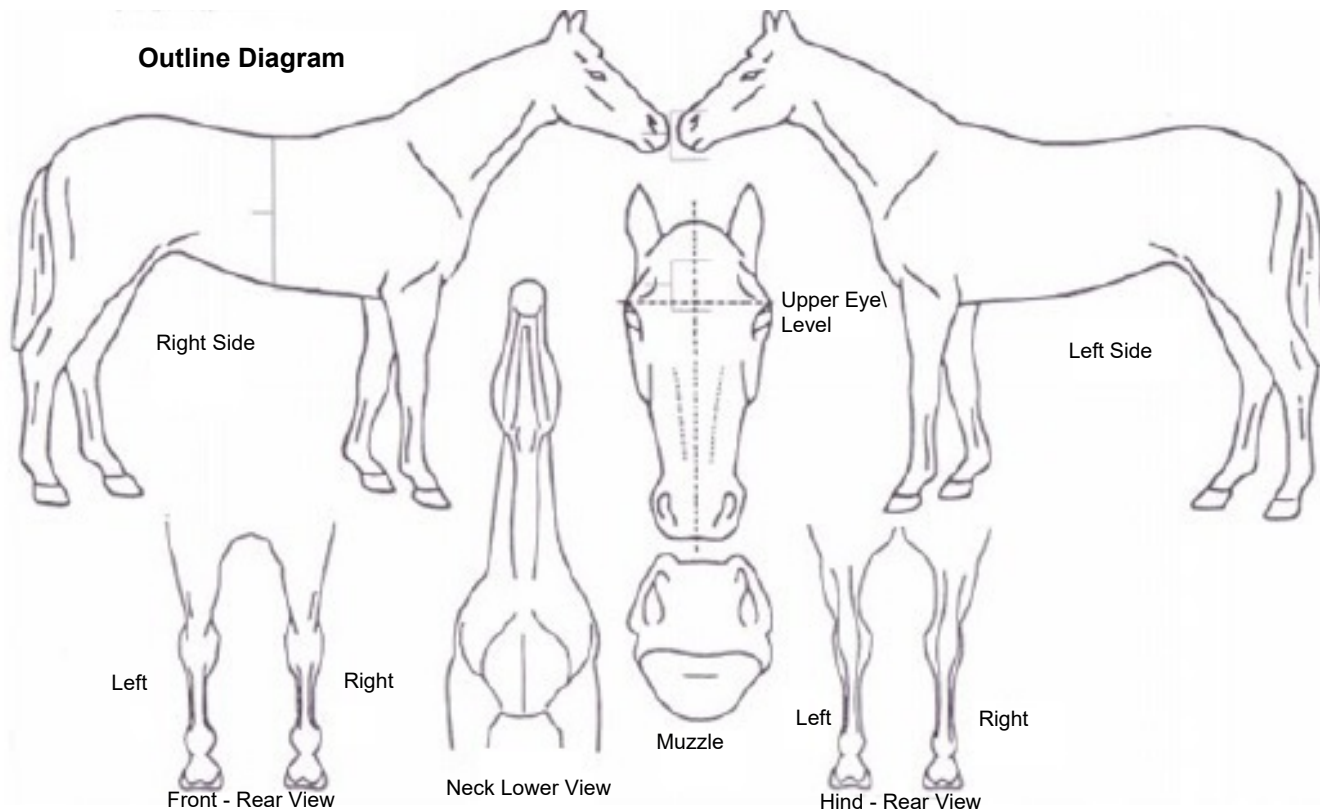

1. Inspection shall be completed no sooner than 10 days prior to title eligibility.
2. The adopter is responsible for scheduling and paying for inspections. Approved inspectors are as follow:
 - a. Licensed Veterinarian
 - b. Registered Animal Technician
 - c. State or Federal Animal Technician
 - d. Animal Control Officer (with large animal training)
 - e. Brand/Livestock Inspector
 - f. Tribal Conservation Officer
3. The inspector must scan the animal's microchip in order to confirm identity.
4. Photographs from the day of inspection must accompany the completed inspection form. (photos should be date/time stamped)
5. Complete forms and photographs must be submitted to

 - b. Failure to provide the required information, may result in the removal of the animal.
