


California poppy is native to western California & Oregon

✓ Seed oil mixed with bear fat, as a hair dressing






✓ Boiled greens as a vegetable

Adelbert von Chamisso 1781-1838





Eschscholzia californica

Archibald Menzies 1754-1852






California poppy became state flower in 1903
